

This Week....Milton Little, President and CEO, United Way Greater Atlanta

Milton J. Little, Jr. became the first African-American president of United Way of Greater Atlanta, the second-largest in the national system, in July 2007. Altogether, Little has helped raise more than half a billion dollars for local community needs and priorities. Before joining United Way, he served as chief operating officer and interim president and CEO of the National Urban League. He graduated magna cum laude from Morehouse College with a B.A. in sociology and earned an M.A. in urban sociology and social policy from Columbia University. He is a member of many boards and advisory committees. Notable among them are the Center for Assessment and Policy Development, chair of the Southern Education Foundation, and as vice chair of the board of directors for Ways to Work.

Little is a native New Yorker and is married to Traci Gibson Little. He has two sons, Milton and Taylor, and three grandchildren: Joi, Miles and Langston.

Bill Crane is nearing 30 years as a senior communications strategist. He began his career in broadcasting, and later served in senior communications staff positions under Georgia's Gold Dome as well as on Capitol Hill, working for two U.S. Senators and one Governor, in both major political parties. Crane also has significant economic development experience, serving as Vice-President of Marketing and Communications for the **Metro Atlanta Chamber of Commerce** and **Forward Atlanta** during Atlanta's Olympic years.

During the prior decade, Crane was a Senior Vice President with the **GCI Group**, a global public relations firm, where he helmed client engagements for **AFLAC**, **Cousins Properties**, **Deloitte Consulting**, **InterContinental Hotels Group**, and **Johnson & Johnson** among others.

Since the 2000 Presidential Election, Crane has become one of the southeast's most visible political analysts and commentators, first with **11Alive News**, Atlanta's NBC affiliate, and now Channel 2's **WSB-TV Action News**. Crane added radio commentary in 2006, since providing analysis for **WSB-95.5 FM** as well as **750AM**, and other CMG properties. In 2009, Crane began a weekly and now syndicated political column entitled "**One Man's Opinion**." In addition to his hometown newspapers in DeKalb County, **The Champion** (DeKalb's legal organ) and **DeKalb's Champion Free Press**, "**One Man's Opinion**" appears in **The Brunswick News**, **Our Town Gwinnett**, **The Darien News**, **AccessWDUN.com**, **WSBRadio.com** as well as several dozen other print and online media outlets across Georgia.

Also in 2009, Crane opened his own shop, **CSI Crane, LLC**, providing a full range of marketing, public affairs, and communications services to individuals and corporations. CSI Crane specializes in corporate reputation and executive visibility, strategic media relations and thought leadership, as well as crisis communications particularly well suited for the needs of highly regulated industries.

Crane is a graduate of the Grady College of Journalism at the University of Georgia. He remains an avid Bulldog fan, and the proud father of two daughters, and grandfather of twin boys. He travels frequently for business and as a keynote speaker and is active as a board member on more than half a dozen non-profit organizations. Crane lives in Scottdale, Georgia, the offices of CSI Crane are nearby in Decatur.

As the saying goes, "no good deed goes unrewarded!" At least, thanks to the Rotary Club of Gwinnett, no one would have ever heard of Michele Bourdonnay and the many things that she quietly goes about doing in her everyday life. Read on to find out why Rotarians surprised her on her doorstep recently and how she ended up the talk of the town. You will be inspired by this story! Be sure to read to the end!

Each year, the Rotary Club of Gwinnett recognizes a Gwinnett County Public School (GCPS) bus driver who goes above and beyond in our community. Because of COVID19, the annual GCPS Transportation training was not held in person, so we had to find a creative way to recognize our recipient.

On August 17, Club President Terry Swaim, along with other club Rotarians, attended a Publisher's Clearing House-style surprise at the home of Michele Bourdonnay. She was presented a plaque, flowers, balloons and a \$500 check.

A little about Michele: She, along with her family, offers community outreach with Atlanta Dream Center. They go to low-income housing and provide activities for the children, participating in a compassion night where they go to downtown Atlanta and set up a barbeque for the homeless. After eating, they provide blankets, toiletries, food items etc., as well as offer a moving clothing boutique and shower truck. They have another outreach program called Princess Night where they go out late at night and give roses and encouragement cards to the prostitutes and try to get them off the streets, while also

speaking with the pimps to try to get them off the streets as well.

During the pandemic, Michele continues to go into Atlanta and hand out meals - she also delivers meals daily to GCPS students. Before Michele worked for GCPS, she was an Elementary teacher in Abu Dhabi for seven years. When returning to the states, she applied for a bus driver position, while gathering all required documentation from Abu Dhabi government and the U.S., which is needed to teach in Georgia, since her license lapsed in the U.S. while teaching in Abu Dhabi. Michele has completed everything needed to teach, but says her heart is now with the Special Needs students she transports, and has decided to continue being a bus driver. She shared with us that being a bus driver it is one of the most rewarding jobs she has ever had. As if all of this was not enough, on her available time she is making specialty cakes and cupcakes, and has provided many for her co-workers. Michele always has a positive attitude and great dedication to her students.



On a whim, I did an online auction, indicating that whatever I took in for one of my dog paintings would be spent solely for pet food donations for Never Alone. I raised enough money to buy another 125 pounds! That month, our group was able to deliver 500 pounds of food!

After a meeting, I stopped by Never Alone to drop off a few more donations and the staff that was working, curiously asked if I were "the Dog Food Lady." I smiled and said, "I didn't know there was one, but I did drop off quite a bit last month, so maybe that is me?" She joyously jumped up and exclaimed "VIRTUAL HUG!" And, she asked me to come behind the desk so she could show me the client log. In the log were lists of clients and a column asking if they needed pet food. She scrolled through pages and there were so many who answered yes. She told stories of how so many were helped and how they came back with photos and stories of how much their pets enjoyed the food. The only sad part is that they ran out. She told me that she didn't know who we did it, but that we need to keep doing what we do because it is vital and often overlooked. It was such an emotional moment, we were both teary-eyed.

No one who is struggling should have to choose between feeding themselves and a pet. No one struggling should have to give up a pet. It IS BECAUSE they are struggling that they NEED that pet more than ever. The pet offers companionship, relaxation, stress management and joy. It is now my "PET PROJECT" to ensure that Never Alone is stocked with pet food. I'll be continuing pet art, using 100% of all proceeds to purchase pet food.




