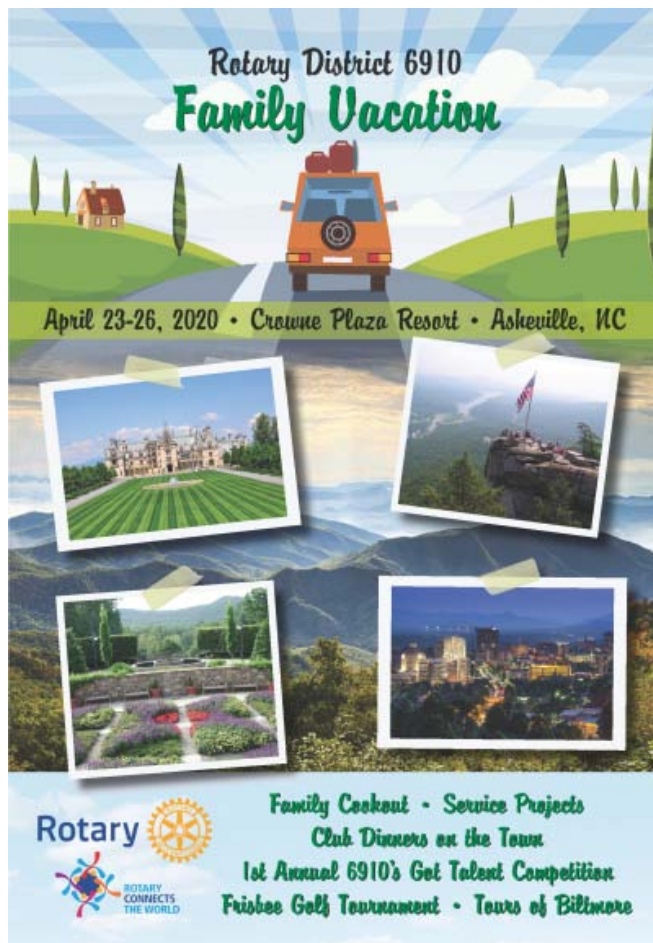

NAHANT ◆ The season of giving isn◆t quite over yet.

As they have for the last 13 years, the Sonia and the Capano families will be hosting their annual Freezin for a Reason Polar Plunge fundraiser at Nahant's Short Beach Wednesday. This year's funds will go to benefit the educational nonprofit Camp Rotary.

George Sonia, a Lynn native and event co-organizer, says what initially began as a fun and different way to ring in the new year eventually morphed into something much more.

◆ Maybe five years ago, we had the idea to turn it over into a fundraiser for different charities every year, ◆ Sonia said.

Last January, proceeds went to a scholarship fund in memory of family friend Kelly Martin. Sonia says the event was able to raise \$22,000 for the scholarship through its t-shirt sales and from prizes raffled off during the plunge's after-party at Rolly's Tavern in Lynn.

It was through these prior fundraising efforts that the two families became familiar with Camp Rotary.

◆ Through all these different projects, through all these different fundraisers, I met so many people who went to camp rotary, and they were all so happy to give back to it, ◆ Sonia said.

In a press release for the event, camp director Rich Cowell described Camp Rotary ◆ which is one of the longest-running Rotary Club service projects in the world ◆ as ◆ an incredibly special place ◆ for kids.

◆ It's a unique place where campers sleep in modern cabins, eat in a brand-new, modern dining hall ◆ yet experience the programs, camaraderie, and values of a traditional American overnight camp, ◆ he said. ◆ We commit to continuing to kindle the fires of friendship in a safe, fun, outdoor environment that develops a camper's independence and confidence. ◆

For Sonia, Freezin for a Reason is made all the more special by the community members who take time out of their schedules and come out in waves to support each year's cause.

◆ That's the whole beauty of what we do. It's a fun day. We all do the same things every day, but this is definitely something different, ◆ he said.

◆ We probably have 200, 300 people down there. It's a great way to start the year. ◆

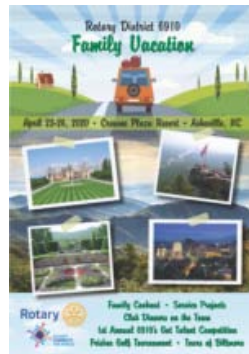

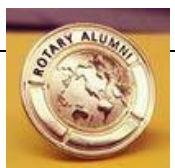

Merry Christmas, Happy Hanukah, Season♦s Greetings, & Happy New Year! At our home ♦Merry Christmas♦ is the appropriate greeting, but however you are celebrating these mid-winter nights, I hope you have a safe and happy time gathered with your friends and families celebrating the events of 2019 and planning for the amazing adventures that await us in 2020. As the rest of the world prepares to greet a New Year, the ♦Rotary Year♦ barrels right past its half-way mark and on into the 2nd half filled with more service projects, training opportunities, Family of Rotary gatherings and, of course, *Rotary Family Vacation* at the Crowne Plaza Resort in beautiful Asheville, NC, from April 23-26, 2020.



I am happy to report that I have completed my ♦official visits♦ and now I can concentrate on visiting clubs for service projects, award presentations, and just to say ♦Hello.♦ If your club has an event that they want me to attend, please email me and get on my calendar sooner rather than later. Having had the opportunity to sit down with all the Boards of our clubs, I remain absolutely amazed at all that you are doing for your communities, in our District and for the Rotary World. You have proven over and over that you are truly ♦Connected♦ at home and around the world.

We are still 3 months away from our earliest required reporting dates for most goals and 6 months from our final accounting for the 2018-2019 Rotary Year, but I want to give you a brief update on your documented success so far. In Membership we are up 62 members as of today, with 34 clubs showing net growth and only 18 down at this point. The 18 Clubs are down a total of only 35 members, so a net positive year is well within reach for them and an outstanding year within reach for the entire District. On Polio Plus most clubs hosted special events as requested and club giving for End Polio Now is up over \$9,000 over this time last year. Total Foundation giving outside Polio is up over \$50,000 above last year indicating that clubs are fulfilling the generous pledges they made. On the Service front I am happy to report that, with many more projects unreported than reported at this point, over 1800 Rotarians have donated over 9,000 service hours and clubs have contributed over \$278,000 to service projects in our District. I have asked each club President, as a personal favor to me, to be certain to report all your service projects, member participation, hours worked, and funds donated this year. Be sure to make sure your Club is reporting; I am looking forward to reporting to you the astounding numbers at the end of the year.

Since our last issue we had many Polio events, participated in an outstanding Zone Institute, named a new District Governor Nominee for 2022-2023, held some outstanding service projects, dedicated a new Peace Pole in Lawrenceville, and participated in a lot of great Family of Rotary events. Rotary - Short Term Youth Exchange Summer 2020 Program Details ♦ Spain, Italy, Germany, France

I would like to share with you a very exciting program for **high school students** in District 6910. Many Rotarians are unaware of the excellent opportunities available through the **Rotary Short Term Youth Exchange Program**. This program allows for a short term cultural exchange during the summer and is open to any High School Student residing in District 6910. **This is an English speaking program. No language skills are required.** If you have a high school student or know one that would benefit from this program, please share this email with them.

The **Rotary Short Term Youth Exchange Program** exchange program could be the opportunity of a life time. Every participant that has taken part in the program rates it as one of the best experiences they have ever had.

To better understand the program, here are some key points and the Who, What, When, Where:

1. **Who?** High school students between 15 and 18.5 years old. Must live and go to school within District 6910.
2. **What?** Six-week short-term exchanges consisting of 3 weeks with a host family in another country and 3 weeks hosting in your home concurrently.
3. **Where?** The 4 most common countries are **Spain, Italy, Germany, and France**. There are 16 other countries also on the approved list. Although it is helpful to have some exposure to the language of the country you will be visiting, you do not need to be fluent in a foreign language. English is the language of the program.
4. **How?** A multi-step process beginning with a student application and local Rotary Club sponsorship. Please contact Burton Blackmar (Blackmar1@gmail.com)
5. **What does the short term program cost?** \$1,700 to \$2,200 is a good estimate. Costs include: Airline ticket for your child, insurance (medical for your child), spending money (for your child), & hosting expenses such as food & entertainment (for inbound student). There is also a small administrative fee to cover district expenses such as background checks, etc.

Application deadline is **March 15, 2020** for Summer 2020 Short Term Youth Exchange Program.

Rotary Club of Jefferson Flag Project

JEFFERSON ROTARY CLUB FLAG PROGRAM



Clubs throughout Rotary District 6910 might wish to emulate the Jefferson club, which accomplishes two purposes: allowing citizens to show their patriotism and raising money for the club's projects. More than 200 flags are distributed each patriotic holiday and the number is growing.

It is both a service project and a fundraiser that honors and memorializes all veterans, POWs and active duty military personnel. Ron King is chairman and founder of the program. King and other club members install U.S flags on patriotic holidays at residences and businesses in the Jefferson area. Residents lease the flags and King makes sure the flags are always clean and have a new appearance each time. The are stored at American Legion Post 56 in Jefferson so they remain vibrant and untorn.

Rotarians place a sleeve in yards to hold the metal pole with the 3' X 5' flag. The sleeve is short and doesn't interfere with mowing or other yard maintenance, King

noted.

Businesses also lease flags from the club at \$40 for six months and \$45 for a year.

Club President Jon Howell praised King and his dedicated committee for their year-round efforts on behalf of veterans and the club itself. For just \$35 a year, Rotarians deliver the flags to the leased locations several days prior to five patriotic holidays: Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day, Patriots Day and Veterans Day. In addition, the club also donates a flag to be flown at the family home of an active duty soldier or Marine for the duration of his duty.

A side-effect and benefit of the project is that other residents see what their neighbors and Rotarians are doing and decide to buy their own flags.
