My Rotary journey began 40 years ago when I joined the Rotary Club of Decatur, Alabama, at the age of 25, and it has brought my family and me many unforgettable moments. But nothing could have prepared me for connecting with the world as president of Rotary International. My individual Rotary journey has become a shared Rotary journey with each of you.

All of the incredible people Gay and I met this year ♦ Rotarians, Rotaractors, and the extended family of Rotary ♦ will be an inspiration for the rest of our lives. We visited clubs and projects from Uruguay to Ukraine, from Nigeria to New Zealand, and beyond. We were privileged to crisscross the globe, circumnavigating it twice and moving back and forth between the Northern and Southern hemispheres. Each country and each stop held its own Rotary magic. While in Zimbabwe in March, we participated in a medical vocational training team mission with Rotarians from India, providing health, hope, and life itself to the thousands who came for treatment. 

When the Pandemic started to be taken seriously in March, 2020 in the USA, a major national retail warehouse immediately felt it -- not the virus itself, but the ripple effect of the virus. The warehouse had a great quantity of goods that had been returned from the many stores it serviced regionally that were seasonally out of date or not moving off the shelves. The warehouse manager had been selling those items at a fraction of the cost to another company to make a slight profit rather than take a loss. In March, the company that bought and hauled the excess goods stopped everything due to the virus.
