Rotary Club of Covington's Pandemic Project

In early March, when the Corona Virus Pandemic hit the U.S. many retailers across the country were at a loss for what to do with excess inventory as the economy came to a standstill and shoppers were being asked to stay home. One major national retail store so overstock warehouse immediately felt the impact.

The warehouse had an overwhelming quantity of goods that had been returned form the regional stores that were either seasonally out of date or not moving off the shelves.

Previously, the warehouse manager had sold the items at a fraction of the cost to another company to maintain a slight profit rather than taking a loss on the overstocked items. As the

pandemic continued, that company no longer wished to purchase or haul the excess inventory and the retailer s warehouse became overwhelmed as it continued to collect the excess goods from the region s stores.

♦ That ♦s when opportunity made its way to the Rotary Club of Covington, Georgia, ♦ Club Administrative Chair Doug Bolton said. ♦One, actually two, of the club ♦s members own trucking companies. A driver for one of those companies just so happened to be on a delivery when a friend who was the director of a nonprofit asked if the driver could pick up a load of donated goods nearby. The driver asked permission from the owner and the owner, being a Rotarian, immediately agreed if it would help someone in need.

♦ However, he told his driver he wanted to make contact with the warehouse manager to ensure the request was valid. Contact was made, and the manager assured that they did want to donate the goods. Then the Rotarian was asked if he knew of any other nonprofits in need. ♦

That Rotarian happened to be Tarrence T. Houston, the club s foundation chair, and he worked with the manager to provide all of the 501(c)3 information needed to start taking in the excess inventory for donation.

♦Almost immediately the manager asked if a tractor trailer could pick up a load,♦ Bolton said. ♦Tarrence said absolutely and went to pick up the load himself. He returned to the city of Covington to his trailer lot. He had a full trailer load of just about everything the retail stores sold ♦ clothes, household goods, cleaning supplies, over the counter medicines, books, school supplies, food items, etc. While the club board was excited and knew they could help a lot of people in the community in need, the logistics of where to store, sort, organize, and distribute became quickly obvious.♦

As fate would have it, the other club member who owned a trucking company \spadesuit the club \spadesuit s GRSP Chair Wayne Pugh - advised that he just happened to have an empty warehouse that could be used.

♦The generosity of the two trucking company owners to use the trucks and trailers and the warehouse cannot be understated,♦ Bolton said.

During the following two months 10 trailer loads of goods were donated by the generous warehouse manager who asked not to be identified by name or company.

Approximately a quarter of a million dollars worth of goods were distributed to more than 50 nonprofits by the Rotary Club of Covington and thousands of individuals in need were served during a time when many could not afford to purchase those items. As the virus became less of a threat, the company that had been purchasing goods from the warehouse resumed its routine, and the donations to the Rotary Club of Covington ceased, but not before a huge impact was made on so many lives.

♦Rotarians are people of action and in a time where there was an uncertainty for the future, our members took action, ▶ Public Image Chair Jackie Gutknecht said. ♦We are grateful for all of the volunteers who gave of their time and resources to make this massive undertaking a huge success for our community and region. Donations from this partnership spread far and wide and the impact will be felt for years to come. ♦

The five Rotary Clubs have been making headlines these days. For good reason.

Staten Island is home to dozens of not-for-profit organizations whose members share a passion for community service, and the borough so Rotary Clubs work year-round in a number of fundraising capacities, all of which contribute to the betterment of Staten Island.

So, during these trying times amid the ill effects of the coronavirus pandemic, they ve been stepping to the plate in ways we could have never imagined.

Not only have members of the Mid-Island Rotary Club been donating food to restock the food pantries at Our Lady of Good Counsel R.C. Church, the Stapleton Union American Methodist Episcopal (UAME) Church, the St. Peter s Food Pantry and Project Hospitality, but have been distributing PPE including masks and gloves to volunteers and patrons at the above locations. Their next food donation will be in another week.

♦ Since this pandemic began the need for food has risen tremendously, ♦ said Linda Aubrey, secretary of the Mid-Island Rotary Club. ♦ Much of the funds we used for this have been generously donated to the Bernard Del Rey Memorial Fund. Bernard was a prominent Rotarian in our club who passed away too soon, and this money was donated in his name. He always felt the importance of feeding the hungry, so we are continuing his legacy. ♦

Aubrey said the club also supports two Interact Clubs, which is the high school version of Rotary.

♦ This summer, we have been overseeing the help and volunteerism of some high school students who wanted to get involved and help our community. Katie Dougherty, Andrea Chetirko, Marianna Mezzacappa, and Ryan Vann have been helping out at the New Lane Shores. They have been given some administrative work connected to the inventory and distribution of food at the facility, ♦ she said.

Aubrey adds residents at New Lane Shores comprise about 270 units of one- and two-bedroom apartments.

♦ In the past, residents have been fed via the kitchen on the premises, but with the COVID-19 virus, the kitchen has been closed down and many residents have been • quarantined.' Mass gatherings in the cafeteria are not allowed. City Foods, now sends boxes of food twice a week to residents. Our volunteers have been going there to distribute boxes of prepared meals that are ready to heat. There are 10 floors of residents, so this task has been greatly appreciated by both the staff and recipients, she said before stating the motto for Rotary is ◆Service Above Self.◆

One of the goals of the Mid-Island Rotary Club is to fundraise throughout the year so they can award scholarships to deserving high school students who have served the community of Staten Island.

♦ This year, we are awarding a \$5,000 scholarship to Syeda Manahil Jafri of Curtis High School, a \$1,000 Service Award to Angela Bunay of Susan Wagner High School and will be presenting two \$1,000 scholarships to a St. Peter♦s and Notre Dame High School Interact Club senior who has shown outstanding community service, ♦ she states.

A number of grants are usually distributed during this time of year and under normal circumstances, check presentations would be made at breakfast meetings. However, this year, a Rotarian will be making the presentations at respective homes.

Charitable organization receiving a check from the Mid-Island Rotary Club are: On Your Mark, Michael & Cause, Cancer Tamer, the GRACE Foundation, Staten Island Center for Independent Living, Staten Island Technical High School Green Technology Club, Fresh Kills Park, the Staten Island Children & Museum, the Staten Island Museum and Opening Doors Wellness. In addition, the Port Richmond High School Culinary Department will receive a scholarship donation

In addition to Aubrey, who serves as secretary, Mid-Island Rotary Club, officers include Robert Moore, president and Carmine DeSantis, treasurer.

The food pantry committee is comprised of George Dougherty, Marguerite Fiore and John DeAmicis.


