Upcoming Program: Alvin Wilbanks, CEO and Superintendent of Gwinnett County Public Schools



J. Alvin Wilbanks was named chief executive officer and superintendent of Gwinnett County Public Schools in March, 1996. Under his leadership, the school district has exemed a reputation as one of the most successful in the country. As superintendent, Mr. Wilbanks has been tapped by three Georgia governors and two United States Secretaries of Education to help craft significant education-reform legislation at the state and federal levels. He served seven years as chairman of the Board of Trustees for the Teachers Retirement System of Georgia. In 2017, Governor Nathan Deal appointed Mr. Wilbanks to chair the Joint Study Committee charged with establishing a statewide school leadership academy for Georgia. He is a leader in organizations that advocate for public education at the state and national levels, including the Georgia Education Coalition and the national Large Countywide and Suburban District Consortium.

Mr. Wilbanks is the founding president of Gwinnett Technical College, which opened in 1984. Throughout his career, he has won numerous honors for his professional accomplishments and civic contributions, including being named ♦2005 Georgia Superintendent of the Year ♠ and one of four finalists for the national title. Mr. Wilbanks was honored in 2019 with the Georgia Association for Career and Technical Education ♦s first ♠Lifetime Achievement Award. ♠

Mr. Wilbanks earned his bachelor s and master s degrees in education from the University of Georgia, and his education specialist degree from Georgia State University. He is a member of several professional organizations and is a leader in his church.

If you are new to using Zoom, we encourage you to connect at 11-45 an on the day of the meeting. Tom and Mark will also be available between now and Tuesday if you would like to do a one-on-one test to make sure you are comfortable connecting. Just let them know if you would like assistance.

To see and hear everyone and for everyone to see and hear you, you need a computer linked to the internet, video camera, speakers and microphone (a typical laptop, smart phone or iPad has all this built in). If you don't have speakers and a microphone, you can use your telephone to listen to audio and talk to others while watching visual material on the monitor. If you don't have a video camera, you can still do and see

everything except no one will see you.

2 To enter the zoom session click: the meeting link. (if this doesn't open the meeting, copy the address and paste on the browser address line).

3. When the Zoom screen opens click 'open Zoom Meetings' as instructed.

4. After a minute or less, you should see some content on the big screen and a little screen will pop up asking which audio you want to use.

If you have microphone and speaker on your computer, select "Computer Audio". Then choose "Join with Computer Audio" and you are ready to go. If you don't have a microphone and speaker on your computer, select "Phone Call" Then dial any of the phone numbers that pop up and be prepared to give the meeting ID when asked. Then you can listen to everything on the phone. Be sure to click "done" in the box after you have set up the phone call (I usually write the phone number and meeting ID on a piece of paper in case the phone connection is lost and I have to redial).

Recap of last week

This week's speaker was Randy Dellinger, District Manager of Jackson EMC. First chartered in 1938 to serve electricity to rural areas of northeast Georgia where investor-owned and municipal utilities did not serve. They provide electricity from Jimmy Carter Boulevard to Athens over to Dahlonega.

Jackson EMC was organized as a result of President F.D. Roosevelt's Rural Electrification Administration as part of the New Deal programs. It is one of 39 non-profit membership owned electric cooperatives and the largest in Georgia. Of the energy they sell, 50% is Gwinnett based-approximately 120,000 customers.

Randy went on to tell us that Jackson EMC considers themselves a good corporate citizen, by helping communities in need. They are very cognizant of using their customer's money. One of their biggest ways to contribute is through their "Operation Round Up" - the members opt in to having their bills rounded-up to the nearest dollar. With customers giving less than one dollar each month has enabled them to put \$15 million dollars back into the community over the last 15 years - those pennics add up!
