The **mission of The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International** is to enable Rotarians to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty.

For the past 13 years the RF has been top rated by Charity Navigator.

Top priority has been ending Polio last year only 140 cases in the world even with lower vaccines due to covid. Only 1 case so far this year. Polio vaccines have resumed with extra precautions in place. The Polio network also has been a huge help reaching the world with PPE and precaution protocols.

Rotary has 7 areas of Focus with grants being available for the 7th area starting in July of this year (which Schelly is super excited about!).

Peace and conflict prevention/resolution.
Disease prevention and treatment.

Water and sanitation.

Maternal and child health.

Basic education and literacy.

Economic and community development.

The Environment.

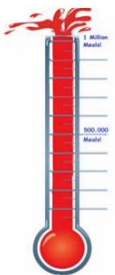
1 MILLION MEALS!!!!

Thanks everyone and when DG Tina set the crazy goal of 1 Million Meals we thought it would take all year but we just did it in 7 months WOW!! Please spread the good news and here are a couple of stats to share with your Club. Remember you can still report your Club's food projects in the Feed10Millin database by clicking on this [link](#).

- As of this morning District 6910 has provided 1,041,442 meals
- That equals 625 tons of food
- We have done 149 food projects so far an average of 5 projects every week
- 32 of our 73 Clubs have reported a food project in the Feed10Million database

Most important of all **we have helped thousands of families** in our communities. According to the Georgia Food Bank Association the number of food insecure people in the counties served by District 6910 Rotary Clubs has increased by 67% from 362,230 to 540,720 people.

1. **Farmers to Families is back!** (see [flyer](#)) ♦ This is a USDA program that in response to COVID provides **food truck deliveries for free** through local charitable organizations like Rotary. Doug Bolton out of the Covington Club is coordinating these deliveries across the District, so if you club is interested in receiving one of these truckloads of free food, contact Doug at dougbolton@yahoo.com.
2. **\$500 District Matching Grant** (see [link](#)) ♦ Don't forget this first-come-first-served opportunity to get a **\$500 matching grant from the District** to provide food or PPE in your community. We have extended the grant deadline to February 26. Click on this [LINK](#) to learn more. The link will take you to the webpage about applying for a District Grant. 3. **Log your meal projects** - Remember in Rotary it doesn't count until the paperwork is done, so click [here](#) to log your meals each time you complete a project.
