World Polio Day is Oct 24

We have eliminated two types of polio from the world. Only Type 1 still exists in the wild.

Wild polio is cornered in Pakistan and Afghanistan—It hasn't occurred anywhere else in the world in the last 3 years, including Africa.

We must not let up until Type 1 is destroyed. If we do, the monster will quickly reemerge all over the world.

The effort to destroy the last vestige of polio requires money, dedication and great personal risk by some people.

We will be discussing details of this final challenging push over the next 3 weeks leading up to World Polio Day on Oct 24.
