

D6910 Disaster Relief Team Announces Recent Donations

Saturday, May 1, 2021

Tim Ranney and the Disaster Relief Team has been hard at work supporting efforts to identify ways Rotarians in District 6910 can help, not just in our zone, but around the world. In addition to continuing efforts with the Farmers to Families program and providing FREE masks to local communities, the district team recently announced the following outreach initiatives:

1. St. Vincent & the Grenadines Volcanic Eruption - D6910 donated \$500 to these relief efforts.

2. COVID Relief Efforts In India - D6910 committed \$2,000 in District Designated Funds through a Global Matching grant titled, "Saving Lives through Oxygen." It's focus is COVID-19 Pandemic which has caused a big threat to human lives in India as people in need of oxygen are dying and hospitals are not able to take care of admitted patients. Plans include the development of an oxygen plant (long-term relief) and an oxygen concentrator (immediate relief) to save precious lives.

3. Newnan Tornado Relief Fund - At 12:10 a.m. on Friday morning, March 26, 2021, an EF4 (Enhanced Fujita Scale) Tornado came through the historic residential district of Newnan, Georgia. The tornado reached wind speeds as high as 170 mph and caused catastrophic damage. The tornado damaged 1,800 homes and left 10,000 Newnan Utilities customers without power. There have been over 300 homes that have been listed as uninhabitable. Atkinson Elementary and Newnan High School both received severe damage. The city's low to moderate income residential area received major damage. D6910 sent \$1,000 to the Newnan Tornado Relief Fund.

May is Rotary History Month

In honor of Rotary History Month here are five fun facts you might not know about Rotary. #1 - Service Above Self was not Rotary so original motto. In 1911, at the 2nd Rotary convention in Portland, Oregon, the motto He Profits Most Who Serves the Best was adopted as the official Rotary motto. Service Above Self was adopted as the principal motto in 1950. Learn more here.

#2 - Rotary s polio eradication efforts began on September 29, 1979, when Rotarians, in partnership with the Philippine Ministry of Health, administered drops of the oral polio vaccine to children at a health center in Guadalupe Viejo, Makati, Philippines. That project s success led Rotary to make polio eradication a top priority. Rotary launched PolioPlus in 1985 and was a founding member of the Global Polio Eradication Initiatives in 1988.

#3 - Rotary was a major player during the 1918 flu pandemic. Just like during the COVID-19 pandemic, clubs were inspired to adapt and act. They adjusted how they met, following local guidelines of the time, and took action to help give local governments and health providers necessary services and support.

#4 - On 23 February 1905, Paul Harris, Gustavus Loehr, Silvester Schiele, and Hiram Shorey gathered at Loehr so office, Room 711 of the Unity Building in downtown Chicago, for what would later be known as the first Rotary club meeting. For the 1980 Rotary International Convention in Chicago, local Rotarians rented that same space and used period furnishings to recreate the scene. Take a virtual tour here

#5 - As Rotary s president emeritus, Paul Harris traveled extensively during the 1920s and 1930s. During these trips, the nature-loving Harris planted trees to symbolize goodwill and friendship. Ever since, Rotarians have planted trees in the name of fellowship, friendship, and community service. These trees, which can be found worldwide, have grown into enduring monuments of Rotary i ideals. Learn more here.
