President Elbert ran the bell to open our meeting. He called on PP George Lee to lead members in singing for the first time in many months. George then led members in Pledge to the flag. Cater Thompson came forward to offer the prayer.

President Elbert introduced the guests and reviewed members birthdays and anniversaries.



CART brags were good this week.

President Elbert informed members the club will be changing the meeting time on Mondays, but he did not elaborate on a date for this to start as it will be a discussion point for the board meeting on July 20th. He mentioned there are plans to return to the lunch buffet as soon as July 26th.



President Elbert called on Jeffery Monroe, board member and club Foundation Chair, to present two Paul Harris Fellow +2 awards. Marcus Tripp and David Frolich.

President Elbert called on Past President George Lee to introduce today's speaker. Lynn Durham is the President and CEO of Georgia Core. Georgia Core is a state supported nonprofit proponent of cancer care in Georgia. Lynn has a doctorate degree in education and became President and CEO after 25 years in university administration and management. She is a cancer survivor.



Georgia Core started in 2003 as a non-profit with goals to attract clinical trials to Georgia to study new drugs and treatment, as well as increase cancer research and education. There are 450,000 cancer survivors in Georgia and the organization makes sure they have the care they need. In 2019 cancer was 21% of all state deaths. The pandemic postponed much of the screenings in 2020 and has made it very important for all citizens to return to the needed screenings. Currently there are 730 ongoing clinical trials in Georgia.

Georgia Core partners with local hospitals and cancer centers to bring the best minds and researchers to the state. They also work closely with palliative care facilities.

Lynn outlined the five actions that save lives.

- Screen for colorectal cancer
- Avoid lung cancer
- Address disparity in breast cancer screening and deaths
- Protect more African American men from prostate cancer
- Reverse decline in cervical cancer screening

Some of Georgia Core's funding comes from the annual payments of the tobacco lawsuits and the sale of two new auto tags.

Lynn told members they can.

- Get screening
- Purchase the new auto tags
- Participate in a clinical trial
- Donate to research thru Ga Income tax form
- Advocate for more from the Tobacco fund
- Donate directly to Georgia Core

Excused Absence

Members have the opportunity to receive a board approved Excused Absence during a long-term family, health, or business crisis.
