Gene and Jason urged members to help find speakers for our meetings.


How You Help a Community

Genevieve George and Maureen Cotter spoke to us about their organization **Impact100 Martin County** that has provided more than \$480,000 in grants in its first 3 years.

Several professional women gathered and discussed how they might best help Martin County with a focused funding program to improve our community. There were many good programs already underway and they thought that they might help raise the awareness of these groups while providing funds and new possibilities to Martin County NGOS.

They formed Impact100, asking each other for \$1100 in funding. The first year they



raised \$107,000. After presentations, site visits and evaluations, the first grant was awarded to Project Lift for the Pathway Academy that helps at risk students complete their high school education and receive counseling and learn career skills to move on in their lives.

The second year, the selected need was to help Hobe Sound Kindergarten students improve their reading readiness. The final result was a program and all materials that raised the readiness levels from 20% to 80%! Take a look at the video:

Impact100 had raised an extra \$124,000. This grant went to the Covid Consortium in July and was shared by 14 organizations during the last 6 months.

The group is looking for new organizations to help. You must pledge to keep the project moving forward in following years. They have 20 applications already being developed for the new funding. Applications can be filed up until Feb. 28^{th.}

The grants will be awarded on Aprill 8th at the Lyric Theatre. It is expected that there will be 2 \$100,000 grants. For more information go to www.lmpact100martincounty.com.
