Global Grant for Ak-Tenamit

The District is working to create and furnish a computer education facility at the high school campus in Guatemala. A budget of \$58,000 has been raised to achieve this from District Clubs and RI. There will be 2 groups of 20 who travel to Guatemala in February to spend a week building this facility. Youth, Peace, and Action

Develop quality peace projects through youth service clubs, scaled with technology and supported by Rotary Club leadership in local communities. This could include online peace Education Certification for up to 50 high school service clubs and 2,000 students.

My friends and fellow Rotarians,

In 1982 the Rotary International Board set forth the goal to immunize every child in the world against the devastating disease of Polio. At the time there were a quarter of a million US citizens permanently paralyzed by Polio, some 350,000 new cases striking citizens of every nation each year, and between ten and twenty million Polio survivors worldwide. Never had such an audacious goal been set by any organization, nor one that would have as sweeping an effect on every man, woman, and child on the planet. Rotarians took up this cause with unmatched enthusiasm, raising hundreds of millions of dollars and partnering with the World Health Organization, UNICEF, the CDC, and now The Gates Foundation. Then, as only Rotarians do, they went *themselves* to every corner of the globe, to vast cities and the smallest villages, into jungles and war zones, to administer the life-saving vaccine into the very mouths of children, two drops at a time. This feat was nothing short of astounding and changed our world forever. That is Rotary: Vision, Focus, and *Action* in service of humanity.



District 6930 Global Grant for AkTenamit

Governor Michael officially launched the District 6930 Global Grant Project for AkTenamit at the District Conference on May 22. The concept is for all 6930 clubs to join together in a significant international project that offers opportunities for hands on participation in the project by District 6930 Rotarians of all levels of physical capabilities, at a reasonable cost, with adequate accommodations and meaningful interaction with the project beneficiaries.

AkTenamit is a school for indigenous children in the jungle of eastern Guatemala that was founded by the son of a Rotarian in our District in 1992. Using a rural appropriate educational system which has received international acclaim, AkTenamit has developed healthcare, agricultural, sustainable tourism and community development programs which are highly prized by young people who formerly did not have an opportunity for education beyond the 6th grade. The school has grown from 155 middle school students in 2001 to over 800 junior/senior high students in 2021, 46% of whom are girls. The current school campus cannot serve the many young people who want to attend. Because of this, AkTenamit is going to build a second campus about an hour away from the main campus. Our District Project will be to raise the money for and build a solar powered sanitary facility for the new campus.

The cost of construction of the sanitary facility with solar power will be \$58,000. We will apply for a Global Grant to include \$15,000 of District Designated Funds and matches from the Rotary Foundation. Under current Rotary Foundation Global Grant funding rules, we need to raise \$31,000 in cash from our clubs. We already have \$16,000 committed, and a number of clubs made pledges of support at the District Conference.

To apply for a Global Grant, we need firm commitments from each club on how much each will contribute. There is no minimum. We hope every club will contribute something. Once you have determined how much you will contribute, please notify Jim Sisserson, nosressis@aol.com, of the amount. Even if your club has made a pledge, please confirm it by e-mail. You do not need to send any cash at this time, but it is necessary to know the commitments for the application **NLT July 31**. You will be notified when and where to send the cash once the grant is approved.

Participation in this project will count towards the Rotary Citation as well as the District

Governor's Citation. More importantly, your club will be part our District's combined effort to **Serve to Change Lives**. Information about joining a team to go to Guatemala and work on the project in February 2022 will follow in a letter to all Rotarians.

Meet the next RI President, Shekhar Mehta, Rotary Club of Calcutta-Mahanagar, West Bengal, India



Mehta, an accountant, is chair of the Skyline Group, a real estate development company he founded. He is also a director of Operation Eyesight Universal (India), a Canada-based organization. He has been actively involved in disaster response and is a trustee of ShelterBox, UK. After the 2004 Indian Ocean tsunami, he helped build nearly 500 homes for families affected by the disaster. He pioneered a program that has performed more than 1,500 life-changing heart surgeries in South Asia. He is also the architect of the TEACH Program, which promotes literacy throughout India and has reached thousands of schools. A Rotary member since 1984, Mehta has served Rotary as director, member or chair of several committees, zone coordinator, training leader, member of The Rotary Foundation Cadre of Technical Advisers, and district governor. He is also the chair of Rotary Foundation (India) and has received Rotary's Service Above Self Award and The Rotary Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service and Distinguished Service Awards. He and his

wife, Rashi, are Major Donors and members of the Bequest Society.
