## Rotary News for August 5, 2021

Roc Fiore spoke about a plan to establish a Rotary Global Grant to fund the drilling of a Water well in South Sudan. This would involve working with local students who comprise the membership of Water (H2O). The students were original sponsors of a well drilling drive last year.

He plans to ask the club members to raise \$5,000 and match a Foundation Grant of \$5,000 and ask our Rotary District 6930 to match that funding for another \$5,000. This \$15,000 would pay for a well being drilled in South Sudan where this organization has already drilled 502 wells over the last few years.

## Safe Space

Dr. Teresa Albizu, CEO of Safe Space, introduced us to the only certified domestic violence agency serving Martin, St Lucie and Indian River Counties.



During the last two years, they have answered over 2,500 hotline crisis calls each year, facilitated shelter to an average of 350 victims annually, and served close to 400 survivors each year through the outreach programs.

The Emergency Shelter is a 60-bed safe haven and they provide, food clothing and counseling. The programs include crisis intervention, education, support and advocacy. Claudia Hood told us about the Crisis Hotline. Staffed with professionally trained staff members who evaluate the need for medical attention, immediate safety needs, and development of an escape plan, if needed.

The outreach programs include relocation assistance, legal assistance and referrals with community partners.

Legal assistance and representation free of charge is available for filing injunctions against abusive partners as well as help filing for child support.
