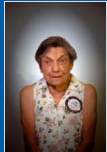

Many churches and other aid groups on the Treasure Coast are trying to help with initial shipments to established relief organizations that survived the damage. Rotary will keep us posted on their efforts.

## Tip of the Month

**Tip of the Month #1:** Admins for Social media and websites

For social media pages and websites it is highly suggested that more than one person is the admin. In that way there is a backup in case a member is no longer a member or active.

Create a Gmail account such as *yourrotaryclub@gmail.com* and use this email for all social media accounts and Google resources, as well as any other online resources used by the club. You can then provide the login account and password information to anyone you want using it as well as keeping it on file by executive. If you have just one member that has all the information and that person completely disappears, the process is much more difficult. The logins and passwords should be passed to each new president to keep them in the public image loop.

To make changes:

For Facebook - Have the current admin add another member as an admin. Once that is done, the new admin can delete the old admin.

For Instagram - Get the account name and password for the Instagram account. Go

into the account and change the corresponding email, password, and phone number (if it uses one) for the account. The admin of the Facebook Page can then link the Instagram account to the Facebook Fan Page.

For Twitter - Get the account name and password for the Twitter Account. Go into the account and change the corresponding email, phone number, and password for the account. This would be basically the same for LinkedIn.

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### **Creating a story to show on District Home page on DACdb**

Go to DACdb > My Club > EZ Story

Click the blue button NEW STORY

Add Story Name (This is the Title of your Story, as it appears internally) and Headline (Enter Story Title / Headline as it will appear when it is published)

Stages of Publishing:

Draft ♦ The initial stage as the story is being created, editing can be done in this stage

Review ♦ The article is ready for review ♦ this stage can be bypassed

Approved ♦ Stories are ready to be published but are not yet visible in any other area of DACdb

Published ♦ Stories are visible and displayed in the areas indicated

Archived ♦ Stories are available but archived. They must be restored before they can be edited or referenced

Dates of Publication:

Story Start date ♦ Default is the date the story is started

Post Until date ♦ **this date IS IMPORTANT!** Be sure to have an end date to the story so expired information no longer shows on the Home page of DACdb. Leaving this area blank means the story will show forever.

Show Story in:

W ♦ Website

H ♦ Home page of DACdb

D ♦ Dashboard

B ♦ EZ bulletin

M ♦ EMeeting

**Remember to click the Orange SAVE button often during the creating of stories. Unlike Word documents there is no auto-save.**
