Val introduced Lucie McGuire of Jensen Beach to the Club. Lucie told us how she had taken her own experience and is packaging it for Martin County Students to give them exposure to other cultures and geography!

Lucie described her experience of redirecting her life through a semester abroad through Indian River State College. She was dealing with the passing of her father and other issues in 2017. Her counselor at IRSC suggested a change for a semester ♦ Classes and Travel abroad!



She traveled to Prague and Hong Kong during her semester. Prague allowed her to visit 10 European countries and have lectures on European History, culture, foods and governments. Hong Kong exposed her to the Asian world she had only read about.
