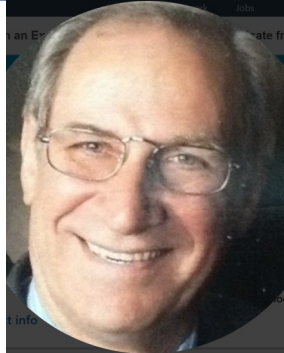

### PDG GEORGE ROBERTSON-BURNETT

George Robertson-Burnett, Rotary Club of Bartow, Past Club President, Past District Governor, Rotary coordinator for Zone 34, which has over 800 clubs and includes Georgia, Florida, and parts of the Caribbean region, and all-round active Rotarian. George was born in Aberdeen, Scotland and was educated at Aberdeen Grammar School. He is a Paul Harris Fellow, Major Rotary Donor etc. Obviously he is not one of those Scotsmen with short arms and deep pockets. He spent a short time as a journalist, HM Government, Hotelier and Restaurateur before selling all his business interests in the U.K. and moving to the U.S. in 2004 with his family and he became an American Citizens in 2015. George was named District Rotarian of the Year in both 2011 and 2012 and received a District 'Service Above Self Award' in 2013 – amongst other Rotary accolades.

His lovely lilting Scottish accent was a source of some 'misunderstandings' when he arrived in the U.S., but like all "foreigners" he has adapted his accent and voice to be understood in his new country. He began by telling us about the U.K. and the four countries that go to its makeup, namely: England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. [Ailish's note: Although the map of Ireland was shown during his presentation, lest there be any doubt, The Republic of Ireland is an independent sovereign nation and not affiliated with the U.K.]. He told us about "The Wall" between Scotland and England that the Scots got the Roman Empire to pay for its construction. This is Hadrian's Wall built in 50 B.C. and parts of it are still in existence and all parts are now designated as a U.N. Heritage Site. He was introduced to Rotary by his bank manager and attended his first meeting. Thereafter he was 'hooked' on Rotary. George talked at length about his personal growth in Rotary and how much he appreciated the fellowship of all Rotarians and the meaning of fellowship, service and giving. Rotary is an organization where everybody knows your name and everybody is glad to see you. Each club is a franchise and each club has its own unique culture and traditions which makes them all so special. In these challenging times all Rotarians everywhere have adapted to new terminology, new traditions, new challenges and have all found innovative ways to help their communities. Most clubs meet through Zoom and have cooking shows, social gatherings, bring a friend, home tours, Rotary pets (of the 4 or 2-legged types) and food drives and always with an emphasis on fellowship. He talked about Winston Churchill being an active Rotarian with the Rotary Club of London and had a few of his quotes to relate. Well done, George. You are a great Rotarian and a great friend to us all.

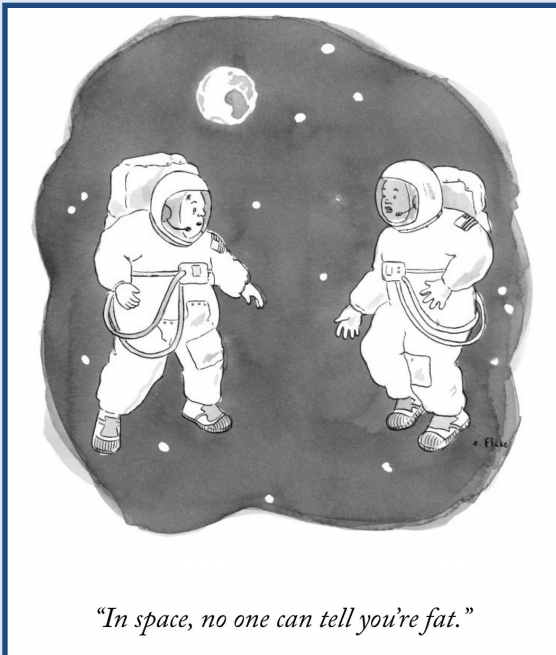

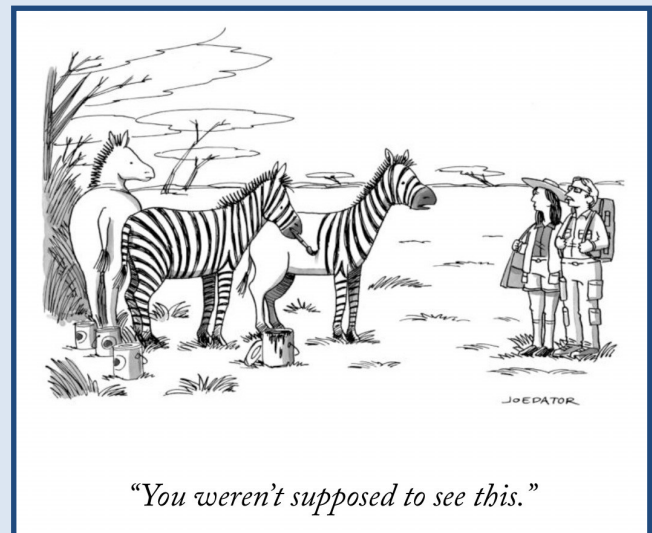
