Ed regaled us with his stories on fishing, our environment and local history. Most of the group did not know that the Treasure Coast encompasses tropical and sub-tropical zones. That is why we have so many kinds of fish. Within a ten-mile radius of the St. Lucie there are 880 species of fish,

One of our earliest industries was as a commercial fishing center. With the coming of the railroad and refrigeration our fish could reach the cities of the Northeast and Mid-West quickly. Around 1900 there was a switch to being a Sports Fishing Center.

We became known as the ♦Tarpan Fishing Capital♦ because of their abundance in the St. Lucie. When President Grover Cleveland retired, he would come to Stuart to fish and even bought property in Stuart ♦ downtown area to build a home. Unfortunately, he dies before he was able to build his Florida dream.
