Today we welcome our very own Chuck Anderson with Pasco County United Way.

Last Week's Meeting

Our speaker last week, introduced by Bruce Mills, was our very own Brent Simon. Brent is an Eminent Domain Lawyer serving all of Florida. He and his wife, Lisa, have two children and four grandchildren. Brent has been fishing since he was five and hunting since he was 10. He said, "My father taught me to fish, I taught my son, and now my son is teaching his son." There's a reason it's called fishing and not catching, you don't always catch something. Brent explained that you have to catch them when they are hungry, either early morning or evening. Brent's number one tip is, "Find a good captain, a professional who will teach you." All fish take different techniques, whether it's the type of hook or bait that you use. His second tip was to take a non-drowsy Dramamine before heading out on a fishing trip. One of the benefits of getting up early to go fishing is you get to see some beautiful sunrises. Brent told the story of how it took four men to pull in a yellow fin tuna. He said that fishing is fun not boring.

Brent told of some adventures with Bruce Mills and gator hunting. Lisa and Blaise also enjoy the hunt. Gators love to eat chicken, so it's not hard to come up with some bait. They have gone hunting from a john boat or an air boat. You first start out with a compound bow, then a harpoon and then a bang stick.

When you finally get it in the boat, you tape it's mouth shut and tie it's front feet behind it's head. Sometimes when you think they are dead, they are just knocked out temporarily and you don't want an angry, live, injured alligator on your boat. The largest alligator Brent has killed was 11 feet. He said that the best part of meat from an alligator is from under the jaws. Brent has boots made from some of his gator hides, as well as Maxine Stewart made a purse for Lisa. He gave every one that attended the meeting a bony scute, which are embedded underneath the dermal layers of the skin acting as a protection of the alligator's internal organs and tissues.

Brent then told us about crabbing and that you need a license to do so. You can have five traps per person and your name, phone number and address have to be on it. The bait used is pigs feet. In warm weather the crabs are very active and in the cooler weather they are calmer. When asked what his best catch was, he first replied, "Probably the yellow fin tuna" and then immediately corrected himself and said, "I mean the best catch was Lisa." She loves to fish, but doesn't like to eat it.

Gail thanked Brent for an interesting and fun program. A donation to the local Pack-a-Sack program will be made in his name.





Veterans' Day Update by Gail Armstrong

This year we will not be doing our regular Veterans' Day Program due to health and safety concerns. However, we still want to make sure that we recognize what Veterans in our community have done for our country. Greg Wegener and his committee have been working on a plan to honor and support some of our veterans most in need.

Greg has been in contact with both Meals on Wheels in Pasco County and the Baldomero Lopez State Veterans' Facility in Land O'Lakes. Meals on Wheels is serving approximately 130 veterans and the Veterans' Facility has about 120 residents. Our Club will be working with these organizations to make sure their veterans are recognized for their service.

Packages will be made for each veteran. For the Meals on Wheels veterans we will be doing a custom bag with our Club's name and logo and a thank you on it. It will include a challenge coin, a handwritten thank you card, and hygiene items. Hygiene items were requested by the Meals on Wheels supervisor as something that is always needed and appreciated.

For the Veterans at Baldomero, we will do packages that include a gift bag, a challenge coin, a handwritten thank you and a Tervis cup with a message on it or some other item. In addition, through his conversations with the managers there, Greg and his committee are looking at possibly planting trees and placing a plaque there, putting up banners with words of recognition and thanks for residents to see from their windows, re-doing 5 benches that are no longer usable and donating a large number of higher quality adult incontinence items than the veterans receive from the state funding there.
