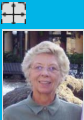

(Evanston IL) ♦ January 15, 2021 Under the direction of Michael McGovern, Rotary International Chair and Past Rotary International Vice President, Rotary Leadership Institute (RLI) International will seat its inaugural board of directors this month. Two Rotarians from the RLI Sunshine Division (covering Florida, Georgia, Puerto Rico and the Caribbean) have been tapped to serve on this new board: Past District Governor Timothy Schuler of District 6950 and Past District Governor Margie Kersey of District 6900.

The CART Fund is a charity started by Rotarians that is dedicated to finding a cure for Alzheimer's Disease through the funding of cutting-edge research.

From July 1st - December 31, 2020, our District contributions to CART totaled \$10,143. This is quite impressive given the struggles our clubs have had to overcome these last 6 months.

Also, my thanks to Kenny and the entire Krauss family for a recent donation of \$20,000 to the CART Fund. The donation will be reflected in January 2021 and credited to the Rotary Club of Pinellas Park. What an amazing and extremely generous gift to CART from this family and on behalf of everyone at The CART Fund and our district, THANK YOU! We are deeply grateful for your continued support and feel honored that this family supports The CART Fund charity at this most generous level.

Alzheimer's Disease is an irreversible, progressive brain disorder that slowly destroys memory and thinking skills, and eventually, the ability to carry out the simplest tasks. It is currently ranked as the 6th leading cause of death in the USA, but recent estimates indicate it may rank 3rd just behind heart disease and cancer.

If you have a family member or friend who has or have had dementia or Alzheimer's Disease, you are aware of how this illness destroys the person and affects those around them. It is simply devastating. My dad suffered with Alzheimer's Disease for more than 10 years and before he passed, did not even recognize his wife of more than 50 years or his children.
