Speaker Highlights September 16th, 2021

Jennifer Edwards Collier County Supervisor of Elections

Jennifer Edwards, the Collier County Supervisor of Elections for the last 20 years highlighted four sections from the "Marco Island Noontime Rotary Club" booklet that was emailed to us prior to the meeting. The sections which she referred to were "Voter Statistics," Voter Turnout," "General Election," and "2022 Election Cycle."

REGARDING "VOTER STATISTICS:"

239,247 registered voters in Collier County

Party Affiliation: 51% Republicans; 24% Democrats; 25% are registered among

9 minor parties

Race: 80% White; 12% Hispanic; 4% Black; 4% Other Gender: 46% Male; 53% Female; 1% Unspecified Gender

Age: 41.3% age 66 and older

Summary: The majority of voters are White Republican Women over age 66.

REGARDING "VOTER TURNOUT:"

While only 39% of Collier County Voters turn out for primaries, we lead the State in turnout for the General Election. In 2016, 87% turned out to vote and in 2020, 90% of County voters turned out to vote, amounting to 209,352 votes. Early Voting and Voting by Mail account for an overwhelming percentage of the votes while Election Day voting turnout was only 13.7%.

REGARDING "GENERAL ELECTION" AND "2022 ELECTION CYCLE:"

Ms. Edwards pointed out that there will be 3 methods of voting: by Mail, Early Voting, and Election Day. She concluded by emphasizing and explaining the security in the elections. Results are transmitted over a secure and encrypted connection to their tabulation room that is NOT CONNECTED TO THE INTERNET. Only 7 employees have access to that room. Audits are held. Paper ballots are kept as a fall back ("You can't hack paper," Edwards said).

Finally, staff is trained about election security, which includes both physical and cyber security.



World Polio Day 2021





In the September/October editions of the Noontime News we feature an informative update on Rotary's progress to rid the World of this paralyzing disease.

Challenges

Rotary and our partners have made tremendous progress against polio, but eliminating all cases is going to take even more progress and perseverance. Afghanistan and Pakistan face unique challenges, including political insecurity, highly mobile populations, difficult terrain, and, in some instances, vaccine refusal and misinformation. With sufficient resources, the commitment of national governments, and innovations that improve access to remote areas, we are optimistic that we can eliminate polio.

Ensuring Success

Rotary has committed to raising \$50 million per year for polio eradication. The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation has pledged to match that 2-to-1, for a total commitment of \$150 million each year. These funds provide much-needed operational support, medical workers, laboratory equipment, and educational materials. Governments, corporations, and private donors all play a crucial role in funding.



Reflections on the 4-Way Test

Is it the truth?

Is it fair to all concerned?

Will it build goodwill and better friendships?

Will it be beneficial to all concerned?

In thinking about Rotary's 4-Way Test it seems to me that those few words can be read and applied to our lives in many ways. At first it might be reasonable think that the test was meant to apply to our business and professional interactions as those were an important part of the foundation of Rotary. But as we consider those four questions in greater depth it becomes apparent that we can apply the test to our personal and family lives and to our community involvement. In fact, the power of that simple test extends far beyond the limits of our business lives.

For example, we can look at each of the four questions individually—is what we are considering acting upon the truth? How do you define the truth? If you look at that first question alone, you can spend lots of time thinking about what the truth is. In some situations, it may be readily apparent. But in other situations, there may be nuances to the truth or individuals may hold firmly to their own truths. The current polarization in our society is proof that people may use different measures in defining the truth.

Perhaps it is helpful then to look at how the four questions relate to each other to help us to navigate difficult decisions or challenging times. I think this is a very Rotarian concept. Consider how Rotary encourages all faiths and beliefs to work together in a respectful way for the betterment of our world. We may have our own cherished beliefs—our truths—and our truths may be different from our neighbors'. However, we can still work together towards the attainment of important agreed-upon goals. Along with that, of course, comes the third question: will it build goodwill and friendships? Hopefully, by being respectful of the needs and concerns of others, we can find solutions to disagreements that previously we thought were unresolvable, and we can thereby build goodwill—even if establishing friendships might be more of a challenge.

And then, the fourth important question: will it be beneficial to all concerned? I don't think that beneficial in this context means that we get everything we want. I think it means that we understand that we can listen to one another—and perhaps disagree—perhaps passionately disagree—but we choose to pursue an overriding goal which is to make our community and our world a better place. Only a naïve individual would think we will always be successful in reaching that goal. But how much might be gained from trying? Might it help to guide you in the challenge that you are confronting at the moment?

I wish that I could enlighten you with answers to the many problems that confront us each day. Unfortunately, I am not up to the task. But perhaps you might consider that beautifully simple 4-Way Test when you are confronted with issues in your personal lives as well as your professional and community-based lives. In a way, taking the time to ponder the answers to the four questions in the test as they relate to a given situation can give us the courage to do what we believe is right and fair, and it can also give us the satisfaction of knowing that we have tried to consider the concerns and needs of other. We have tried to be fair and we have been willing to make adjustments to our initial stance in the interest of achieving a greater benefit.
