Speaker Highlights September 2nd, 2021

Audubon Western Everglades

BRITTANY PIERSMA, a fulltime biologist of Audubon Western Everglades (AWE) introduced us to the "Gopher Tortoise" program and to "Owl Watch"

The Audubon Western Everglades organization was founded in 1961 as an independent non-profit dedicated to protecting Southeast Florida's natural resources and wildlife through advocacy, education, and community science. AWE's 60 volunteers assist with surveying and monitoring.

Both the Burrowing Owl and the Gopher Tortoise are "threatened species" but only the former is federally protected throughout the nation; the gopher tortoise is federally protected only in the Alabama's western counties west of Mobile.

The Burrowing Owl:

Is ground dwelling; digs 6 - 10 ft. long nests; the female lays 2 - 12 eggs and provides incubation for the eggs while the male hunts, provides food, and protects the family inside of the nest.

The male and female are identical in size, about 7.5 - 10 inches tall with a wingspan of 21 - 24 inches and weigh 4.5 - 9 ounces.

The oldest burrowing owl was sighted in Ca. and was at least 9 years and 11 months old.

On Marco Island, there are up to 400 sites with 200 of them being active and monitored by 60+ volunteers.

The Gopher Tortoise:

Originated 60 million years ago; dig deep burrows like a gopher; adults are 8 - 15 inches long and weigh 8 - 15 pounds, with the female being larger than the male; live to be 40 - 60 years.

On Marco Island, Gopher Tortoise Day is celebrated on April 10. There is a survey of all potential Gopher Tortoise habitat to estimate the number of tortoises and their ages, according to the burrow sizes.

Current totals are 165 surveys showing approximately 2,000 potentially occupied burrows for 1,000 tortoises. Many gopher tortoises live around the "Indian Hills" section of the Island.

Both the tortoise and the owl are threatened by several similar adversaries:

Land development (although relocating before clearing land and building can be done); Invasive Species; Traffic; Disease; the Rat Trap Boxes, to list a few.



World Polio Day 2021





In the September/October editions of the Noontime News we will feature an informative update on Rotary's progress to rid the World of this paralyzing disease.

<u>Polio</u>

Poliomyelitis, or polio, is a paralyzing and potentially fatal disease that still threatens children in some parts of the world. Poliovirus invades the nervous system and can cause total paralysis in hours. It can strike people of any age but mainly affects children under five. Polio can be prevented by vaccines, but it is not curable. Unlike most diseases, polio can be eradicated.

<u>PolioPlus</u>

For more than 30 years, Rotary and our partners have driven the effort to eradicate polio worldwide. Our <u>PolioPlus</u> program was the first initiative to tackle global polio eradication by vaccinating children on a massive scale. As a core partner in the <u>Global Polio Eradication Initiative</u>, Rotary focuses on advocacy, fundraising, volunteer recruitment, and awareness-building.

Rotary members have contributed more than \$2.1 billion and countless volunteer hours to protect more than 2.5 billion children in 122 countries from this paralyzing disease. Rotary's advocacy efforts have played a role in decisions by governments to contribute more than \$10 billion to the effort.
