Bob and Jane Moates founded the Kicks for Kids Sneakers Foundation here in Naples in 1987. The sole purpose was to provice a brand new, ina a box, pair of sneakers for needy kids in Collier County.

Bob grew up poor in Abilene, Texas and wore hand me downs. His first year at Valleyview Elementary School in 1933, he wore pants that came down to his claves, and had no shoes. That experience was the driving force to try and help those that did not have proper footwear.

For the next 30 years Bob purchased, at his own expense and gave away, over 15,000 pairs of sneakers. He retired in January of 2017 and the Rotary Club of Naples Bay Foundation, a 501c corporation, took overe the program.

The club raises funds from outside sources and has fundraisers to purchase sneakers. The Rotary Club of Naples Bay is currently working with 21 organizations that serve the under privileged in our community.







Multiple Paul Harris Fellow - A Paul Harris Fellow will receive a new pin for each additional 1,000 personally (or in whose name is) contributed beyond his/her original Paul Harris Fellow.

Paul Harris Society - Paul Harris Fellows who elect to give individual contributions of \$1,000 or more each year to the Annual Fund, PolioPlus Fund, or approved Foundation global grants. This can be accomplished via setting up a direct deposit of \$85 per month or sending in an individual check each year.
