# **Human Trafficking Project**

Chuck Marlowe and President James returned from Rotary International in Hamburg with the idea of addressing human trafficking in our community. At one of our June meetings, our DGE Darryl Keys said he was very interested in such a project, and on July 7 the first ad hoc committee meeting was held at Charlotte State Bank with Pres. James, Alyson Burch, and Shari Smith from Whispering Woods Safe Haven.

Since our first meeting, met three more times and expanded to a committee of 14 members, 5 from our club, 1 from TEAM Punta Gorda, 2 from the Charlotte Harbor Sunset Rotary Club, 2 from Whispering Woods Safe Haven, 1 from C.A.R.E., 2 from the Compass Center, and 1 from the Punta Gorda Police Department. And we're reaching out to the Charlotte Schools and other organizations. This has turned into a coalition!

As we move forward, we're joining with C.A.R.E. in sponsoring a Human Trafficking Awareness forum at Charlotte Technical College on January 22, working toward an even larger Exploitation and Trafficking of Minors forum in April, and hosting one or more film events.
