Museum Mission Statement Founder's declaration The Southwest Florida Military Museum/Library was created as a part of Invest in America's Veterans Foundation (IAVF). The SWFMM&L will operate its business under the 501(c)(3) status held by IAVF. The SWFMM&L shall operate as a separate division of IAVF and will be governed by its own Advisory Board and management committee who will answer to the JAVF Board of Directors. Its mission is to preserve and display the extensive collection of priceless memorabilia and artifacts donated by Veterans and their families to be shared by the general public. It is important that the future generations have available to them the history of the items and of the story's that go with them. We will strive to continue to educate our younger generations of the sacrifices that have been made by the previous generations of military personnel from all wars and branches of service. The goal of the SWFMM&L is to occupy a space large enough to house the thousands of articles in a secure well maintained facility shared with IAVF. The Museum/Library will be a modern showplace that will be a destination for visitors from outside of the area to share the history of the United States Military. The museum will be using state of the art equipment and hands on displays for visitors to share the experiences of the past battles of war. The library areas will have original hard cover military books as well as computer generated reading for all of its visitors to enjoy. There will be a selection of books available for visitors to read on site or to take home. The Museum will invite schools and other organizations to visit for tours accompanied by Veterans to explain the history of what is on display and there shall be no entrance charge for such groups that may want to participate in this program.
