3nd Annual Howard S. Danner, Jr. Wheels for Wheels Cycling Challenge Rotarians Cycling for Wheelchairs October 30, 2021

The Sanibel Captiva Rotary Club is hosting the 3rd Annual *Howard S. Danner, Jr. Wheels for Wheels Cycling Challenge* for Rotarians to raise money for the Sanibel Captiva Rotary Trust Fund*. All monies donated will go to the Wheelchair Foundation**. The Wheelchair Foundation is a nonprofit organization leading an international effort to create awareness of the needs and abilities of people with physical disabilities, to promote the joy of giving, create global friendship, and to deliver a wheelchair to every child, teen and adult in the world who needs one, but cannot afford one. For these people, the Sanibel Captiva Rotary Club and Wheelchair Foundation delivers Hope, Mobility and Independence to many.

The cycling challenge will be open to all Rotarians. Prior to the club event on October 30, 2021, participating Rotarians will obtain \$ per mile donation pledges from Club members, family members, friends, neighbors, etc. to challenge the rider to raise as much money as possible to support the purchase of wheelchairs through the Wheelchair Foundation. Each participating rider will disclose on the pledge form the cycle he or she will use on October 30th. (e.g., road bike, mountain bike, tandem cycle, three-wheeler, e-bike, stationary bike). Participating Riders accumulate miles where and when it is convenient for them, whether it is on the road, a trail or a stationary bike. They also may create or join group rides. Each participating cyclist will assure that each pledge donor has a copy of the completed pledge form and will be responsible for collecting the donation after the event. Pledge donors will also have the option to directly donate to purchase one or more wheelchairs at \$100 per chair.

Each participating cyclist will keep track of his or her miles ridden on or before October 30th, 2021 and will be responsible for collected pledged amounts after the event.

For those on Island on Saturday October 30th we will have a celebration event beginning at 11:00 AM at The Blue Giraffe Restaurant on Par View adjacent The Island Golf Club . All are invited.

October 24 of each year Rotary recognizes our accomplishments in eradicating polio throughout the world. Each club is asked to come up with a project that will be recognized by its members.



Friday's Speaker: Brian Holaway - The History of the Calusa Indians



This week's speaker is Brian Holaway. Brian is a local historian and naturalist and will be discussing the history of the Calusa Indians in this area.

In 1994, Brian joined the staff at South Seas Plantation, and soon earned his Captain s License. He worked for Captiva Cruises for over twenty years as a Captain/Interpretive Guide on their regular shelling trips to Cayo Costa State Park. Fascinated by the history, people and cultures of Southwest Florida, Brian researched the history of the area through extensive reading and learning from long-time residents of the Islands. I am always trying to keep the stories alive, and learn from the past. Firan writes. He helped to create the Interpretive Trail focused on the Calusa culture at the Randell Research Center on Pine Island. He has monitored sea turtle nests on Cayo Costa, and served as a photo scout and guide for National Geographic, Martha Stewart Magazine, Lands End, and

L. L. Bean. In 2016 Brian chose to become a full-time independent nature/shelling/Island guide. His goal? To allow guests to experience and gain appreciation for the waters, islands, shells, plants, marine life, wildlife, history, and people of this unique area of Southwest Florida, according to the Visitor and Convention Bureau of the Beaches of Ft. Myers and Sanibel. The VCB tapped Brian to receive the coveted Junonia Award in 2018, calling him, through quiet, and totally focused on telling the story of our exquisitely natural county through visual, historical, and common sense messages. The VCB also honored Brian with its E-Award in 2014, and the Good Samaritan Award in

Other accomplishments of Brian s include:

- * Earning a Florida Master Naturalist Certification through the University of Florida.
- * Serving as an active Board Member of Friends of Cayo Costa State Park since 2013.
- * Designation as part of the Founders Circle of the Randell Research Center in 1996.
- * Contributing articles regularly to the Times of the Islands, since 2017.
