

Presenting a Paul Harris Fellow Award is the Rotary Foundation's way of expressing its appreciation for a substantial contribution to its humanitarian and educational programs. It is named for our founder, a Chicago attorney, who with three of his business associates, started the movement in 1905. Today, we total 35,000 Clubs in over 200 Countries with 1.2 Million Members.

Paul Harris Fellow recognition is given in appreciation of anyone who contributes, outright or over time, a gift of \$1,000 or more to the Annual Programs Fund, PolioPlus, or an approved Rotary Matching Grant. Recognition consists of a Certificate, a Medallion, and a special Lapel Pin. A multiple Paul Harris is one who has contributed additional \$1,000 gifts to the Foundation and their pins receive additional sapphires or rubies.

While it is an honor to receive a Paul Harris Fellow, it's not just about recognition. It's about what we do in the world as Rotarians and how we fund it. This past week we recognized four of our members with their multiple Paul Harris Awards.

Currently, our Club has 56 members who have achieved Paul Harris Fellow status. Almost all of our members achieved this by our \$25 charge to our quarterly dues that goes to the Rotary Annual Fund over a number of years until reaching \$1,000.

Benefactor recipients are those members who have estate plans to give a minimum of \$1,000 to the Rotary's Endowment Fund in which only the annual income is used annually by the Foundation. Currently our club has 4: Honorary Member James Reid, Don Russell, John Schwandke, and Eldon Bohrofen

Bequest Society recipients are those members have an estate plan at death to bequeath a minimum of \$10,000 to the Rotary Annual Fund. Our club has 3 members: John Schwandke, Bill Harkey, and Eldon Bohrofen.

Major Donors are those members who during their lifetime have given a minimum of \$10,000 to the Rotary Annual Fund. In our club, Bill Harkey has achieved this level.

Paul Harris Society is achieved by annually giving to the Rotary Annual Fund \$1,000. We have 10 members: Paul Barlo, Eldon Bohrofen, Clair Beckmann, Scot Congress, Roger Grogman, Bill Harkey, John Henshaw, Donald McDonald, Bill Rahe, and John White. Their are 250 such members in our district.

The newest recognition is the Polio Plus Society where a member achieves this with an annual gift to the Rotary Polio Fund of \$100. Eldon Bohrofen recently joined this Society membership at the same time our District Chair of the Rotary Foundation, Alfred Current, joined this new membership.


October 24 of each year Rotary recognizes our accomplishments in eradicating polio throughout the world. Each club is asked to come up with a project that will be recognized by its members.

Our club has chosen to create a fun time by having a raffle to raise funds for the Rotary Polio Plus Fund. Members are invited to purchase the winning square selected by a drawing from a total 100 squares numbered from 1 - 100. Each number from 1 - 100 can be purchased by a contribution to the Rotary Polio Plus Fund for \$10.00 each. When all the numbers have been purchased (for \$10 for a total of \$1,000), the drawing will take place to determine who purchased the winning square number. The winner will receive a Paul Harris Fellow valued at \$1,000.

The monies from the purchase of squares will be deposited in our trust fund and sent to RI to the Rotary Polio Plus Fund in the name of the Rotarian with the winning number selected.
Everyone wins: Our club for a fun game enjoyed by all, the lucky Rotarian with the winning number receiving a Paul Harris Fellow and the Rotary Polio Plus Fund receiving \$1,000.

3rd Annual *Howard S. Danner, Jr. Wheels for Wheels Cycling Challenge* ♦
Rotarians Cycling for Wheelchairs
October 30, 2021

The Sanibel Captiva Rotary Club is hosting the 3rd Annual ♦Howard S. Danner, Jr. Wheels for Wheels Cycling Challenge♦ for Rotarians to

raise money for the Sanibel Captiva Rotary Trust Fund*. All monies donated will go to the Wheelchair Foundation**. The Wheelchair Foundation is a nonprofit organization leading an international effort to create awareness of the needs and abilities of people with physical disabilities, to promote the joy of giving, create global friendship, and to deliver a wheelchair to every child, teen and adult in the world who needs one, but cannot afford one. For these people, the Sanibel Captiva Rotary Club and Wheelchair Foundation delivers Hope, Mobility and Independence to many.

The cycling challenge will be open to all Rotarians. Prior to the club event on October 30, 2021, participating Rotarians will obtain \$ per mile donation pledges from Club members, family members, friends, neighbors, etc. to challenge the rider to raise as much money as possible to support the purchase of wheelchairs through the Wheelchair Foundation. Each participating rider will disclose on the pledge form the cycle he or she will use on October 30th. (e.g., road bike, mountain bike, tandem cycle, three-wheeler, e-bike, stationary bike). Participating Riders accumulate miles where and when it is convenient for them, whether it is on the road, a trail or a stationary bike. They also may create or join group rides. Each participating cyclist will assure that each pledge donor has a copy of the completed pledge form and will be responsible for collecting the donation after the event. Pledge donors will also have the option to directly donate to purchase one or more wheelchairs at \$100 per chair.

Each participating cyclist will keep track of his or her miles ridden on or before October 30th, 2021 and will be responsible for collected pledged amounts after the event.

For those on Island on Saturday October 30th we will have a celebration event beginning at 11:00 AM at The Blue Giraffe Restaurant on Par View adjacent The Island Golf Club . All are invited.




