Rotarians Cycling for Wheelchairs

November 21, 2020

The Sanibel Captiva Rotary Club is hosting the 2nd Annual ◆Howard S. Danner, Jr. Wheels for Wheels Cycling Challenge◆ for Rotarians to raise money for the Sanibel Captiva Rotary Trust Fund*. All monies donated will go to the Wheelchair Foundation**. The Wheelchair Foundation is a nonprofit organization leading an international effort to create awareness of the needs and abilities of people with physical disabilities, to promote the joy of giving, create global friendship, and to deliver a wheelchair to every child, teen and adult in the world who needs one, but cannot afford one. For these people, the Sanibel Captiva Rotary Club and Wheelchair Foundation delivers Hope, Mobility and Independence to many.

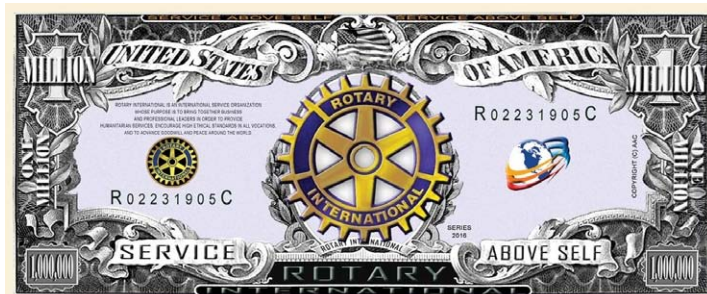
The cycling challenge will be open to all Rotarians. Prior to the club event on November 21st, 2020, participating Rotarians will obtain \$7/mile donation pledges from Club members, family members, friends, neighbors, etc. to challenge the rider to raise as much money as possible to support the purchase of wheelchairs through the Wheelchair Foundation. Each participating rider will disclose on the pledge form the cycle he or she will use on November 21st. (e.g. road bike, mountain bike, tandem cycle, three-wheeler, e-bike, stationary bike). Each participating cyclist will assure that each pledge donor has a copy of the completed pledge form and will be responsible for collecting the donation after the event. Pledge donors will also have the option to directly donate to purchase one or more wheelchairs at \$100 per chair.

Each participating cyclist will keep track of his or her miles ridden on or before November 21st, 2020 and will be responsible for collected pledged amounts after the event.

Current Observations from The Rotary Foundation

It is with great pleasure that I announce that our District 6960 **◆Spending Plan◆** has been approved and the funds have been authorized from The Rotary Foundation to be deposited in our District Grants bank account within the week. For those unfamiliar with this process, a **◆spending plan◆** is a grant application that I, your

District Rotary Foundation Chair, submit to The Rotary Foundation on behalf of the district that lists all the club grants approved by our SHARE Committee to use DDF (District Designated Funds) for club community projects. This year, our spending plan will fund 45 grants totaling \$199,982.00 of DDF. The total expenditures for the good works our clubs will do is at least \$582,001.00. We have 44 of 49 active clubs using DDF this year.
