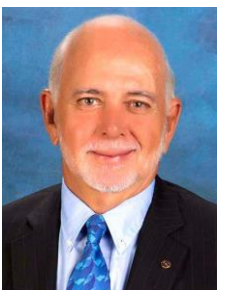

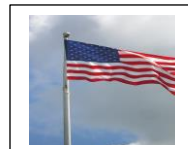

**SPEAKER NOTES FROM: 6-21-19**



**CHET SADLER'S RECENT TRIP TO GUATEMALA.** Chet joined a group of other Rotarians from the States and Guatemalan Rotarians for the express reason to distribute 160 specially designed wheelchairs adaptable to the rugged mountainous terrain of this country. It took a whole day after arrival in Guatemala to arrive at their 1<sup>st</sup> distribution point – Colotenang - where the group distributed 150 wheelchairs. Then on to a rather isolated area of the country straight up in the extremely mountainous region of Guatemala - Ixtahuacan. Here the group delivered 50 children's wheelchairs. Medical exploration of the cause of the many children born with birth injuries in this region are under investigation and study. Our own San-Cap Rotary member, Dr. Michael Rabb, is connecting with doctors and medical researchers in Guatemala and investigating the possible reasons for the high percentages of birth defects in Guatemala and how preventative measures can be addressed.

Chet, also, made a visit to the La Suiza/De LaGente coffee co-op coffee farm roasting and grinding facility that San-Cap Rotary has supported over the last five years through micro-farming loans to the co-op. LaSuisa is a 6-hour drive from where the group was staying and transportation to the area was in a very crowded 4-wheel pickup truck. Needless to say, when they arrived at LaSuisa a cup of coffee was in order. After a meet and greet with their host, Chet and his fellow travelers had the experience of participating in a quite precise coffee-tasting event. Coffee Tasting is an important part of selecting only the best coffee beans for market. 40,000 pounds of coffee beans are sold from the co-op each year with a 9-star rating. To visit one of the mountain-side coffee farms the group had to climb, yes climb on foot, 1-mile straight up to observe the planting of new coffee plants and observe the grafting methods used to strengthen the coffee plants so they will continue growing and supplying quality coffee beans. This coffee-farming co-op certainly has been a successful investment for Sanibel-Captiva Rotary.
