Virtual Meeting Etiquette

Virtual meetings should be approached in the same manner as in-office, in-person meetings - with professionalism and business presence. Examples of behaviors to avoid on camera or in a manner that others can hear: lying in bed, preparing meals in the kitchen, going to the restroom, watching TV, having conversations with other people, or eating (unless the host encourages eating, such as during a breakfast or lunch meeting). Additional reminders for professional behavior during virtual meetings are below.

MINIMIZE NOISES



Mute yourself if you are not talking – microphones can pick up all kinds of sounds from your typing, to the rustling of your shirt, or taking a sip of coffee.

Turn off notifications - each ping is a distraction to you and meeting participants.

PREPARE FOR YOUR APPEARANCE

Set up good lighting - turn on the lights, sit near a window (not directly in front of it), or have a bright lamp nearby.





When speaking look into the camera. Eye contact is important in virtual meetings as well – it conveys professionalism, confidence, and a positive attitude.

When moving around, walking, or standing up turn off your video.
