Assistant State Attorney in the Fourth Judicial Circuit prior to entering private practice. Senator Bradley is married to Jennifer Bradley, and they have three children. Son, Connor, a graduate of the University of North Florida, daughter Stephanie, a recent UF graduate, and Caroline, who is attending the University of Florida.

Prior to his service in the Florida Senate, Senator Bradley served on the Clay County Commission and as a member of the Board of Trustees for St. Johns River State College. A Republican, he
