
A very informative presentation by

Christina Mershell, Business Development Coordinator for the UF Health Proton Therapy Institute. Since opening its doors, University of Florida Health Proton Therapy Institute has offered thousands of patients a promising alternative to traditional radiation. A lower risk of

side effects, more precise treatment capabilities, and an

impressive success rate make proton therapy an option for patients diagnosed with many different types of cancer. Protons can be directed to reach only the areas of the body that are affected by cancer. This leads to more accurate therapy, with less risk that healthy tissue will be exposed to radiation - and this can reduce the risk of complications and side effects. Fewer treatment complications mean that physicians can deliver higher doses of proton radiation to cancer sites, and an increased dose of proton radiation can improve the chances for a successful outcome.
