Program, or LAMP. The current research goal of the St. Augustine Lighthouse Archaeological Maritime Program (LAMP) is to better

understand and share the

founding story of the oldest port city in the United States, a story of national and international significance. Above all things, the story of our region is a story about the sea. It begins with France and Spain vying for control of the region in the late 16th century, which led to the founding

of the City of St. Augustine. Their research aims to shed

light on how this colonial conflict led to the founding not only of a city, but of a nation and a global society still in the making. They also study how the city has been able to sustain itself continually across the centuries and the impacts that our seaside and riverine geography had on our unique culture and heritage.
