That anniversary will underscore the ties we have and goals we share with the United Nations. RI will host five special events UN Day in New York, three presidential conferences in Paris, Santiago and Rome, and a final celebration just before the RI Convention in Honolulu. This will help us achieve increasing our impact by demonstrating that Rotary s influence in the world has only just begun.

Mike retired from CSX after more than 35 years in railroad Operations, Finance, and Sales and Marketing. Mike has lived all across the U.S., from Maine to Texas to California, but has lived in Northeast Florida the majority of his life.

Mike has been a member of South Jacksonville Rotary for 28 years. He has spent time with Rotarians from at least 100 countries, but he found one of the most life-changing experiences was a National Immunization Trip to India in 2016. For him, it was just one more example how The Rotary Foundation has allowed him to help more people than he ever dreamed possible . and Rotary continues to change him every day.
