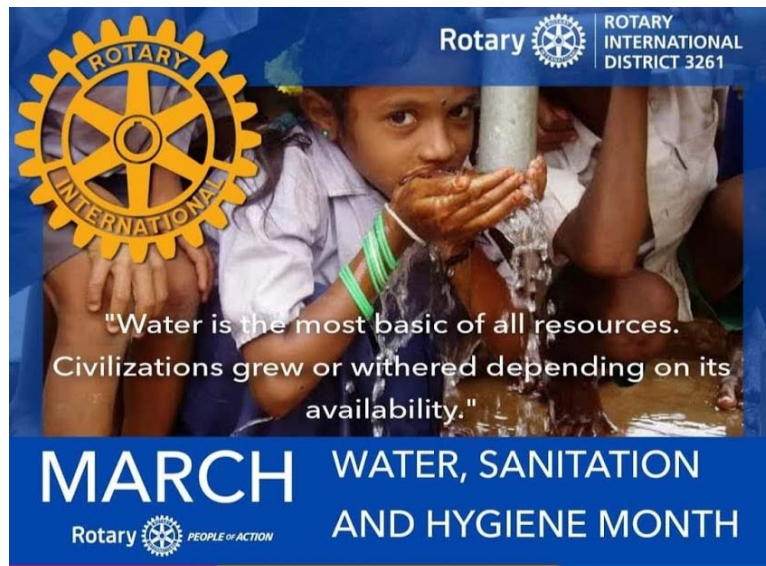

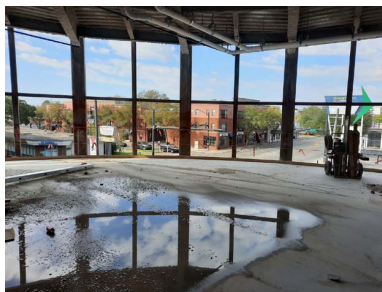

FIELD TRIP to new SANTA FE BLOUNT campus

On Saturday, February 27th, Rotarians were invited to a Fun and Fellowship gathering to tour of the site of Santa Fe College's new Blount Campus. This building will be located on the northwest corner of West University Avenue and North Sixth Street, the former home to the SF College Center for Innovation and Economic Development. Parrish-McCall builders have been making steady, significant progress on the new three-story 87,366 square-foot facility that will become the Blount Hall

The new facility is on track to open to students in the spring of 2022 and will become the new home for the college's Business and IT degree programs. Blount Hall will offer students a full array of student services including admissions, financial aid, academic advising as well as a library and study spaces for both small and larger groups of students. The college's downtown expansion will also provide a convenient location for underserved communities in and around the City of Gainesville to greater access to higher education opportunities in high-demand, high-wage fields of study.

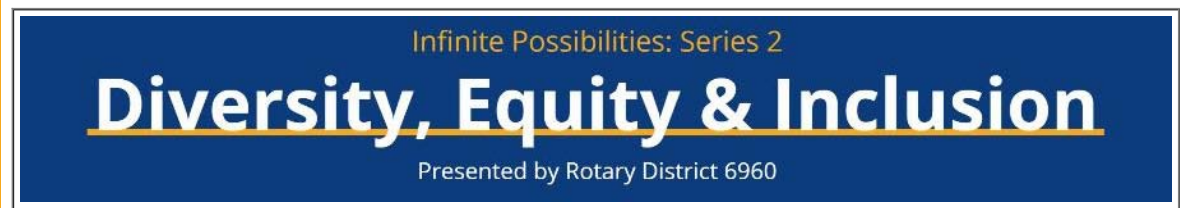

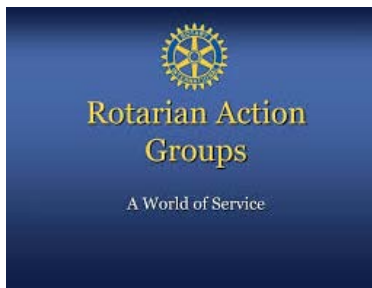
