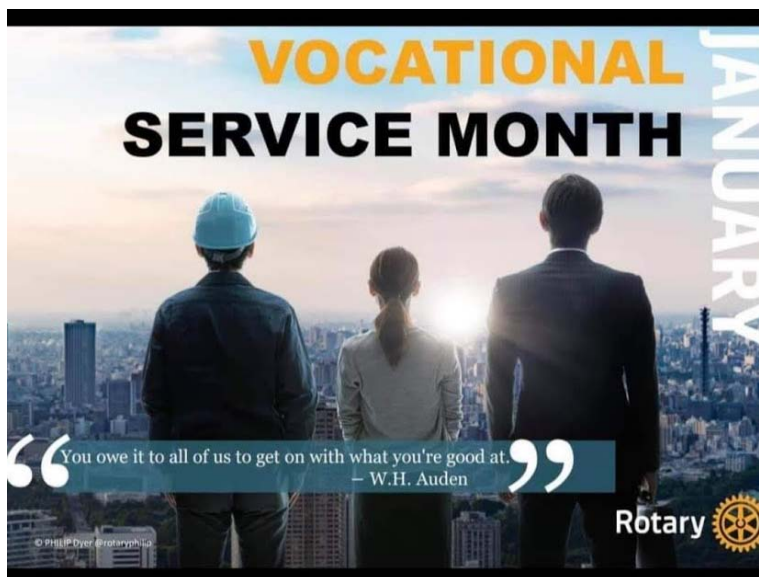

Orville and his brother Wilbur were two American aviation pioneers generally credited with inventing, building, and flying the world's first successful motor-operated airplane.

They made the first controlled, sustained flight of a powered, heavier-than-air aircraft with the Wright Flyer on December 17, 1903, south of Kitty Hawk, North Carolina.

After their pioneering flight, Orville and Wilbur went into business making Wright Flyers for the US Army.

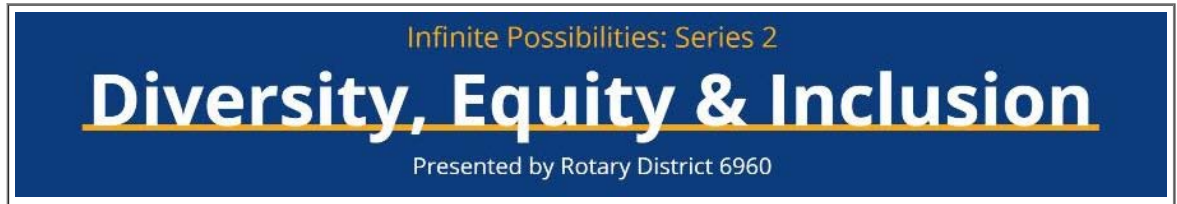
