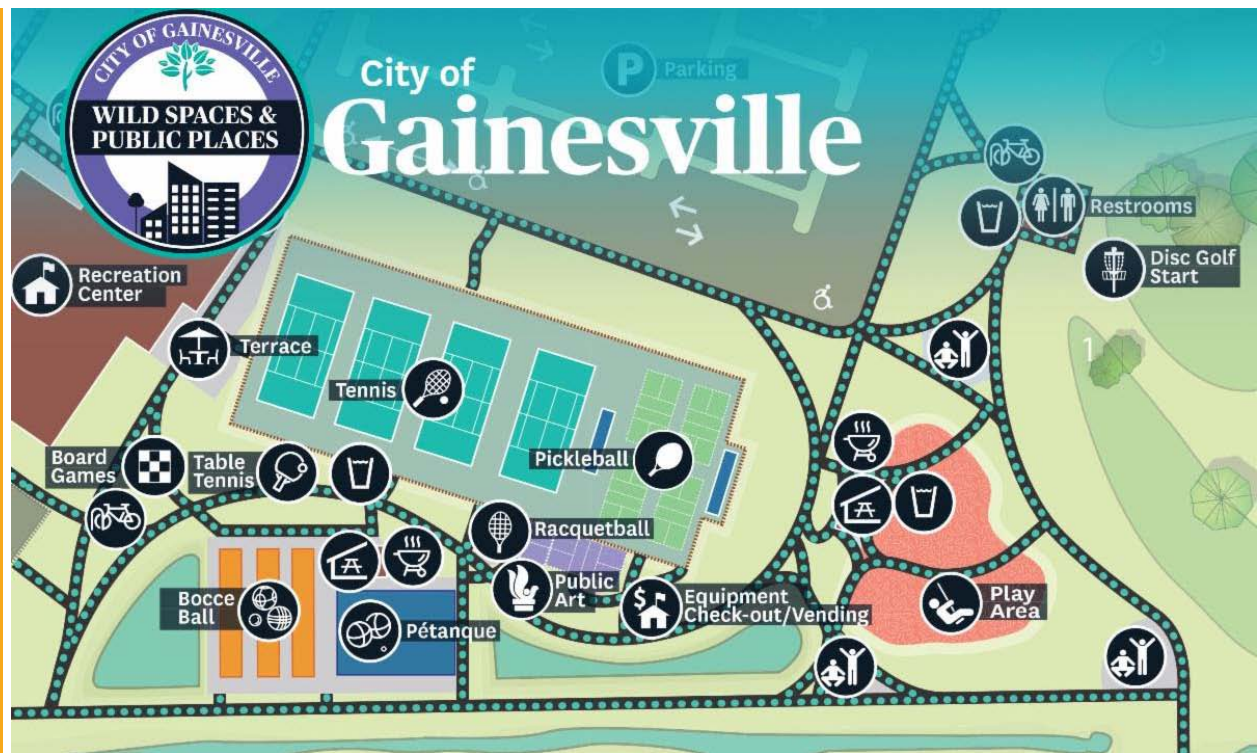
Northside Park and Rotary Generations Recreation area project is COMPLETE!

The park was opened on FRIDAY, OCTOBER 23rd!!

And just in case anyone was wondering who had a major hand in the vision, funding and completion of this amazing new park, here is a reminder....



Over five years in the making, Northside Park is a vision-come-to-life. Despite challenges faced as a result of COVID-19, the Northside Park improvement project is a shining example of what can be accomplished through unwavering commitment and thoughtful collaboration with our neighbors.



Improvements to the park include the addition of 40 parking spaces, a new playground and construction of a multi-generational play area, the Generations Play Zone. The Generations Play Zone was designed to provide activities for neighbors of all ages and will include outdoor games such as bocce ball, pickleball/tennis courts, pétanque, table tennis, checkers and chess. It will also include a terrace off of the Senior Recreation Center, a large pavilion with grills, shaded seating and viewing areas and a walking path with outdoor exercise equipment.

MONUMENTAL ACCOMPLISHMENT

African region declared free of wild poliovirus



Rotary and its GPEI partners celebrate a monumental achievement, say global eradication of wild polio is possible with the continued dedication and persistence of Rotarians

The World Health Organization (WHO) on 25 August announced that transmission of the wild poliovirus has officially been stopped in all 47 countries of its African region. This is a historic and vital step toward global eradication of polio, which is Rotary's top priority.

After decades of hard won gains in the region, Rotary and its partners in the [Global Polio Eradication Initiative \(GPEI\)](#) ♦ WHO, U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, UNICEF, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, and Gavi, the vaccine alliance ♦ are proclaiming the milestone an achievement in public health. They offer it as proof that strong commitment, coordination, and perseverance can rid the world of polio.

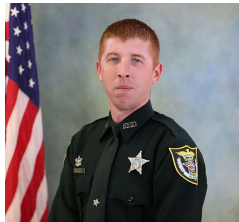
