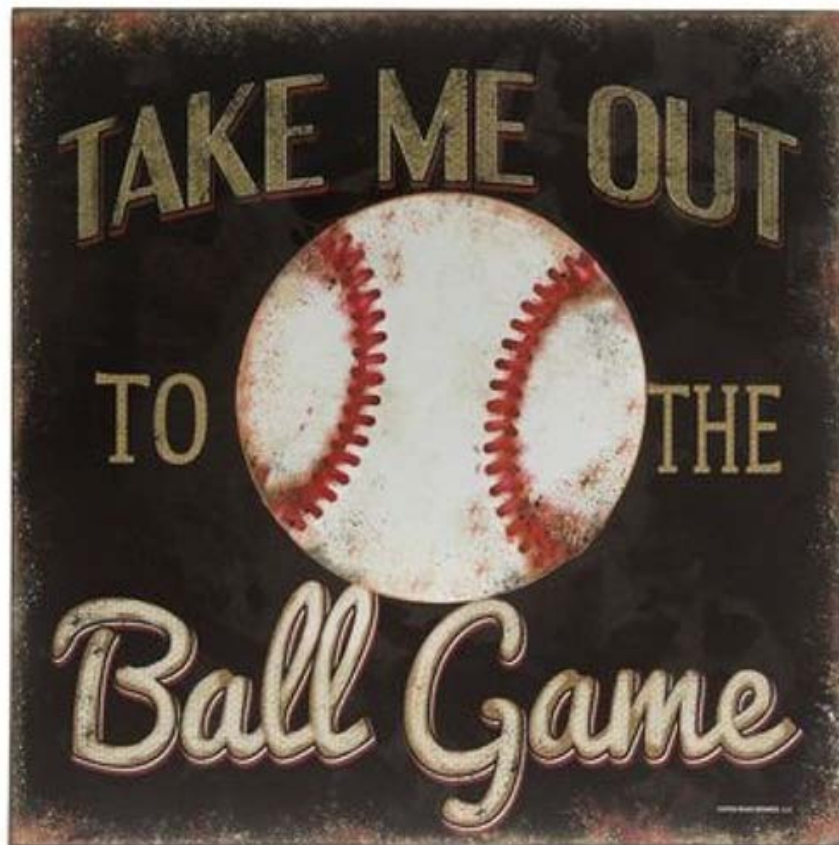

Did You Know? July 22

Rotary International proudly claims 1.3 million members, and some of them are famous. Such as three Presidents: Woodrow Wilson, in Birmingham, AL; Warren G. Harding, in Washington, DC; and John F. Kennedy, in Hyannis, MA.

A would-be president was a member of the Springfield, IL Rotary Club; U.S. Senator and U.N. Ambassador, Adlai Stevenson. A little further north, Supreme Court Justice Harry Blackmun was on the roster of the Rochester, MN, Rotary Club. That same Rochester Club roster also once included Dr. Charles Mayo, co-founder of the Mayo Clinic.

Two Astronauts were Rotarians; Frank Borman and Gordon Cooper were both members of the Houston Rotary Club. Perhaps taking their cue from one of the original aviators, Orville Wright, a member of the Dayton, OH, Club.

◆ and lest we slight the Navy, Admiral Richard Byrd, of the South Pole fame, was a Rotarian in Winchester, VA.



We associate Rotary with business, so it is fitting that Raymond Firestone, founder of the Firestone Tire & Rubber Company, was an Akron, OH, Rotarian, and the legendary retailer, J.C. Penney was a New York City Rotarian. So was Dr. Norman Vincent Peale, the renowned minister and author.

Rotarians have also included artists; Jan Sibelius, the composer from Finland, was a member of the Helsinki Club, and Luciano Pavarotti, the great tenor, was a member of the Modena Club in Italy. Surely, those were clubs that included



singing on their weekly agendas.

Rotarians have even included Hall of Fame baseball players: Connie Mark was in the Ft. Myers Club and Tris Speaker was a member of the Cleveland Rotary Club.

Their names lead one to suggest that if Pete Rose had only followed the Four-Way-test, he would be in the Hall of Fame, too.
