Alicia Vincent, BS has over 15 years of clinical leadership in behavioral healthcare. She provides exceptional leadership with staff and community through major culture shifts, building cohesive teams, and collaborative relationships. Vincent has extensive experience with Committee Development and Management, as-well-as management of multi-million dollar budgets. She has a diverse background as an accomplished conflict manager, team builder, and developer of policies and procedures for best practices in behavioral healthcare. Vincent is experienced in principles and processes that govern the criminal justice, substance abuse, mental health and the child welfare systems.

Vincent has worked for SMA Behavioral Health Services, Inc. for over 15 years in a variety of positions. These included Substance Abuse Counselor for WARM, Assistant Program Director of WARM, Program Director of WARM, and presently Vice President of Flagler Services.

Currently, Vincent is responsible for directly providing oversight and management of all SMA programs within Flagler County. She monitors the program budgets and expenditures, collaborates with the finance department to address inconsistencies and program needs, monitors payer source and utilization of benefits usage, managing performance measures correcting errors and underperformance, serves as SMA community liaison representing SMA at community meetings and events. Vincent reviews and writes procedures in alignment with the organizational policies, mission, and vision and core values of SMA; develops program procedures and revises as necessary. She has extensive knowledge with regulatory, licensure, and credentialing bodies to include but not limited to 65-D-30 and LSF; Medicaid, Medicare, and CARF.

Vincent earned a Bachelor degree in Psychology with a focus on Abnormal Psychology at Bethune Cookman University

Accomplishments include having an instrumental role in the expansion of women's services from 16 to 80 beds; developed and implemented of SMA WAY initiative with leadership team; creation of procedures and oversight for WARM program under her leadership and ensured compliance with CARF standards, resulting in continuous three-year accreditations; and receipt of outstanding audits of documents and services through the Florida Department of Children and Families and Lutheran Services.

Vincent has served on the following committees: SENS (Substance Exposed Newborn Syndrome), SMA Strategic Planning Committee, PSCC (Flagler Public Safety Coordinating Council), MAT (Medication Assisted Treatment) team, Safety/Risk Management, Electronic Medical Records and Performance Improvement Council. 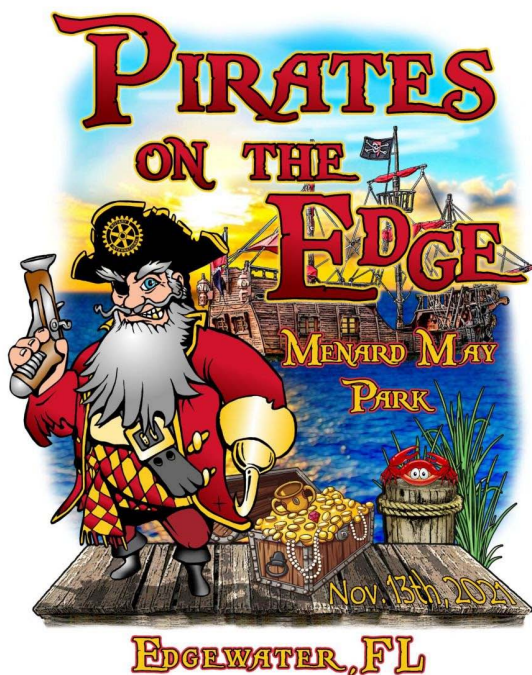
