Polio Update!



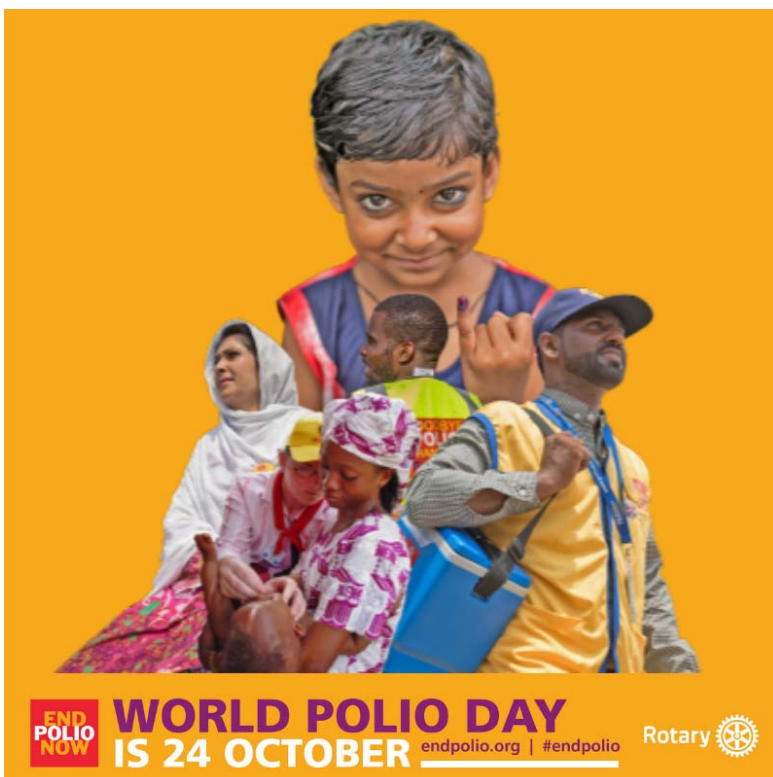
It's a very special Anniversary.

Census Update

VOLUSIA COUNTY POPULATION GROWS 12% SINCE 2010 CENSUS

The U.S. Census Bureau's **America Counts** program has launched a state-by-state look at the demographic changes with the new 2020 Census results. The Sunshine State's 14.6% population growth has pushed Florida past New York as the nation's third largest state with a population of 21.5 million and a growth of 14.6% behind California and Texas. Among the 67 Florida counties, Volusia's population grew 11.9% from 494,593 in 2010 to 553,543 in 2020 and ranked 12th highest in population. Miami-Dade County ranked number one with a growth of 8.2% for the same period with 2,701,767. In addition to population trends, the release provides indicators on housing units, race and ethnicity, diversity and population density.
