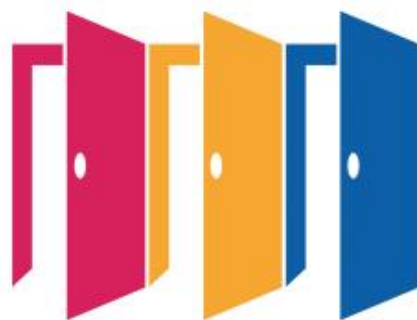


Last Week's Meeting:

We had a Wonderful Zoom Meeting! We heard from our very own rock star, Kaiti Lenhart, Supervisor of Elections. What great timing for her presentation and wonderfully helpful information! Directly from the Supervisor of Elections- Kaiti Lenhart is a Florida native, born and raised in Ormond Beach, Florida. She has been administering elections since 2009 with the Flagler County Elections Office. She was appointed Supervisor of Elections by the Governor of Florida on January 9, 2015, and elected by majority vote during a Universal Primary Contest in August 2016. During her presentation you can feel how much she loves Flagler County, the voting process and the people. Kaiti reminded us that there are 3 ways to vote-early voting, vote by mail and on election day. Kaiti presented many slides to show various trends in the voting process which help her in many different ways including how to budget her resources. As we all know there is a lot of information and concern regarding mail in ballots but Kaiti pointed out that mail in ballots have been going on for many years. She stressed the process of how her staff is trained including identifying 3 points in your signature. She also encouraged everyone that does participate in mail in ballots to track your ballot at FlaglerElections.com. Kaiti reminded everyone that if they move to please contact the area that you moved from and let them know to remove your name off of their rolls and then to contact your current area and provide them with your correct and up to date information. To do this with Flagler County please call 386-313-4170. The early voting places in Flagler County are the GSB (Government Services Building), Flagler County Library and the Palm Coast Community Center. They are working on getting an early voting place in Flagler Beach. I have included a few of her slides that gives an idea of the numbers voting and also that is year marks the 100th anniversary of Women's Right to Vote. Thank you so much Kaiti for taking time out of your busy schedule to enlighten us with a wonderful presentation! Also, it was great to see you!

- If you have moved recently, update your address before you vote. Call (386) 313-4170 to change your address.
- Bring a valid form of photo and signature ID with you.
- Use a Sample Ballot to make your choices and bring it with you to the polls.
- Bring your own black ballpoint pen to use on your official ballot if you do not feel comfortable using the pen provided at your polling location.
- Bring a face covering and wear it during your voting experience, unless you are unable to do so because of a health condition.
- Limit conversation and be patient while waiting in line and also inside the polling room.

Be prepared and stay safe!





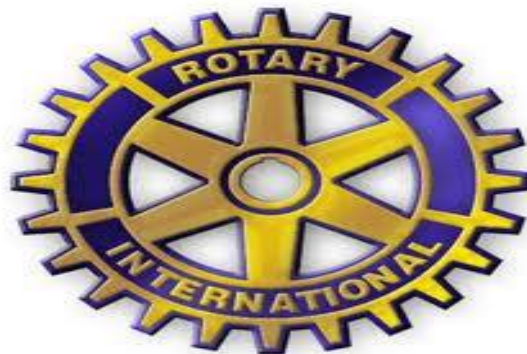
GET TO KNOW YOUR FELLOW ROTARIAN
