During his tenure with the NYPD, Mr. Mulholland worked with the Tactical Patrol Force; Street Crime Unit and was a Confidential Investigator to the First Deputy Police Commissioner.

He is also an adjunct professor at several local universities and the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC), Brunswick, GA. He founded Mulholland Investigation and Forensics in 1997. Most Rotarians are successful professional and business executives because they hear opportunities knock and take advantage of them. 
