Rotary Global Grant: Water for Cambodia

March 22nd is recognized by Rotary International as Clean Water Day. To celebrate and support this day, The Bartram Trail Rotary Club will partner with the Ponte Vedra (Nocatee) Rotary Club and participate in a Rotary Global Grant project called Water for Cambodia.

Water for Cambodia was launched by Rotarians at the request of a Cambodian Children♦s Hospital and was funded by Rotary Foundation Global Grant. The funding from this grant initiated the project with biosand filters and a literacy program for Cambodian impoverished villagers. Since



inception, Water for Cambodia has installed filters that has brought clean and safe water to adults and children. Additionally, this program expanded services to include installation of wells and latrines.

It is the goal of the Rotary Club of Ponte Vedra to provide funding for a minimum of 30 new filtration systems. The Bartram Trail Rotary Club Board approved our participation in this project with a \$500 donation to support this project. Our Club's donation will help to purchase six sand filtration systems bringing clean water to the remote areas of Cambodia.
