International Project: Building Playgrounds in Africa

With a significant contribution from our Club, the 25 member team from Tomoka Christian Church including Club member Linda Bradley, built playgrounds at The Rock and The Ark CarePoint Centers in Okahandja, Namibia for orphaned children living with Aids. These playgrounds were in support of Christ shope International which is dedicated to caring for AIDS-affected, orphaned, and vulnerable children. Children affected by AIDS are often stigmatized and marginalized by society and their communities, severed from their extended family, abandoned and left to live on the streets or in underfunded orphanages.

When the children were not at the centers, the mission team was building the playgrounds. After clearing the grounds of glass and rock, the team shoveled gravel and sand for mixing the cement to ground the support posts. Then they built swings, jungle gyms, rope ladders, bolted tires together to make obstacle courses, etc. Our Club made a \$1000 contribution to support this International project that was used to purchase wood, nuts and bolts, rope, rock, sand and powdered cement. Thanks to this generous support, there are now new playgrounds at the two Carepoint Centers in Okahandja, Namibia.

While there, Linda did more than just help build playgrounds; she built relationships. The caretakers and teachers at the each center work with the children that come on a daily basis. Younger children go to the centers before school for breakfast and the older children go after school for lunch. Team members are assigned to work with the staff. Bradley was assigned to a class of 11-14 year olds and taught a class on personal hygiene, helped with homework and served food. For Wednesday s craft day, Linda picked up over 100 rocks with flat surfaces and washed and spray painted them. The children used Sharpies to write messages, bible verses, names, etc. and placed them around the trees on the playground. On Friday of they played games such as, Simon Says, Duck-Duck Goose, Frisbee, Dodge Ball, Hop Scotch and polished the girl s nails during play breaks.

After the construction was finished, the team watched the children as they arrived at the centers run directly to the playgrounds. However, most of the children stopped short; they didn t know how to play on a playground, so the team taught them how to use the new equipment. The team was grateful to know that their work generated all the smiles and laughter and that the playgrounds brought so much joy to these children.

The children are sponsored by people in other countries. Additional sponsors are always needed as more CarePoint Centers are opened. The \$30 monthly to sponsor a child goes to providing them with shoes, school uniforms and supplies and food provided by the Centers. Bradley spent each day with her twelve-year-old sponsored daughter, Benonia.

Chris Hope s mission is to break the cycle of HIV and AIDS and cares for over 1,400 AIDS affected and vulnerable children in 28 Ministry CarePoint Centers across Africa. The centers provide physical, academic, emotional, spiritual, and social support.


