



Rotary Means Business

Like a growing number of people these days, Bob Wiltfong's job title involves a lot of hyphens. He is a consultant-author-content creator as well as – and most importantly -- dad to three kids. Depending on the day and time, he is doing many of these jobs at once. Here's a look at each of Bob's (paying) jobs.

CONSULTANT




For 20+ years, Bob has worked as a corporate consultant on presentation skills (aka public speaking), and he has rarely been as busy in this arena as he is now. The pandemic forced many companies to do their business online (as opposed to in person) and Bob's background in TV news and acting has made him a unique and sought-after authority on webcam presentation skills. Over the years, he has traveled the world working with Fortune 500 companies like Johnson & Johnson, Charles Schwab and T-Mobile. His recent online clients include Lowe's Home Improvement, the US Army and the IRS. He does this work both independently and as a contractor for a training company headquartered in North Carolina called Hurley Write (https://www.hurleywrite.com/).

Several Rotary clubs in Florida have booked Bob to speak to their groups about this topic this year.

AUTHOR

Bob has also been busy speaking to clubs about his first book, "The BS Dictionary: Uncovering the Origins and True Meanings of Business Speak" (www.thebsdictionary.com). Published last year, the book is a collection of about 300 commonly-used words and phrases used in the business world (ROI, blue sky, synergy, etc.). Bob leaned on his Peabody award winning background as a correspondent on The Daily Show with Jon Stewart to inform the book's tone: educational <u>and</u> funny. Along with co-author, Tim Ito (a former editor at



The Washington Post), Bob defines each term listed in the book, gives you a "BS definition" (a funny take on what it means to say, "it is what it is," for example) and a well-researched origin story for the word or phrase. Since publishing, the book has been featured in Forbes magazine and risen to the top 1% of all book titles available for sale on Amazon. "The BS Dictionary" is available anywhere fine books are sold and Bob is happy to sign copies for his fellow Rotarians.

CONTENT CREATOR



Bob graduated from college with a degree in broadcast news journalism and worked for 10 years as a TV news reporter and anchor. He became an expert storyteller in that field winning multiple Emmys for his work and acquiring the ability to write, shoot, perform and edit his

own content. Combine that with his love of improv comedy (Bob has studied and performed at some of the country's leading improv comedy schools: The Second City in Chicago, the Upright Citizens Brigade in NYC, and The Groundlings in L.A.) and Bob has a unique skillset that has made him a hot commodity for content creation. His work has been highlighted this year at Rotary's state-wide PETS conference and District meetings. In addition, Bob just made a hilarious appearance in a virtual fundraising event for the Florida Theatre in downtown Jacksonville.
