

Meagan brings to the position her substantial experience as our Secretary during lan's Presidency, so the Club's secretarial duties are once again in very good hands.

Linda introduced a catchy new Rotary info game called "Did You Know" which featured various questions about Rotary (like what was founder Paul Harris' vocation?) where the winners were presented with shiny red apples. It was good fun, along with an enjoyable way for us to learn more about Rotary.

A retired insurance exec and PP of the Ormond Beach Rotary Club, Coop treated us to an impressive "first" presentation which included a description of District 6970—63 clubs in a 12 county area from Amelia Island to Gainesville, to New Smyrna Beach with over 3300 women and men.

Indicating that his job is to support us, Coop said that Rotary service just makes you feel good. He briefly referenced incoming **Rotary International (RI) President, Shekhar Mehta,** from India, whose theme this year is "Serve to Change

Lives." Included in his ambitious agenda is "End Polio Now", a major RI effort over the years which started in the mid-80's with one Rotarian in the Philippines who saw polio as a major threat and wanted to deal with it. Since then RI, in partnership with many including the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation, has undertaken to eradicate polio which has been enormously successful, as evidenced this past year when only two cases were reported.

Coop also urged us to participate in **Rotary's new initiative named "Each One, Bring One"** which encourages all Rotarians to grow the membership rolls by introducing at least 1 person to Rotary. Coop concluded his down to earth, hugely informed and lively presentation by urging us to consider attending the **Rotary Leadership Institute on Saturday, August 28 in Palm Coast** where the many facets of Rotary will be on "display." Coop added that he's really looking forward to his first in-person **RI Convention next June in Houston**, having experienced the last two on Zoom. As it's relatively close by, Coop invited all of us to consider attending next June for an awesome Rotary experience.

In commemoration of his first official visit, Prez MB presented Coop with a gift of his favorite bourbon, along with the customary check in support of the RI Foundation. As MaryBeth said, "He really put the organization of Rotary into perspective the layers of an onion! The more you peel away the more you find all the reaches of Rotary." If Coop's visit with us today was any indication, we're all in for a treat this year as he energetically leads the District under the banner of Rotary's iconic mission: "Service Above Self."

MB concluded the meeting with timely words of wisdom, along with a cordial invitation to be on hand for **our next regularly scheduled meeting on Tuesday**,

Club Members Slam Dunk the Junk



About 10 people took part in a littler pickup event sponsored by the Rotary Club of Ponte Vedra in Nocatee on Saturday, July 17th. Under the tag line "Keeping Nocatee Looking Sharp", local Ponte Vedra Rotarians, their family members and a Teen Achiever from the Nocatee Y hauled away an estimated 10 bags of litter from the Crosswater Parkway between the Town Center and Conservation Trail.

The group gathered at the Nocatee Welcome Center at 8am where they were given safety vests and supplies generously provided by David Ray, Nocatee Community Manager. They then spread out in teams along one of Nocatee's main thoroughfares collecting whatever trash they found along the way. Event organizer, Denny Baldwin, Community Service Chair of the Rotary Club of Ponte Vedra, says his club organized the event as a way to help the local community. "Nocatee is a beautiful place that our members call home. This community does a fabulous job of picking up after itself," Baldwin says, "but with so many people making Nocatee home, it's inevitable that some litter is going to accumulate along such a busy road. With the help of Nocatee Community Manager, David Ray, we were more than happy to help make our area cleaner through this event."

Baldwin says one of the Rotary Club's guiding principles is "Service Above Self." A few weeks ago, Ray spoke to the Rotary Club of Ponte Vedra during one of its regular Tuesday morning meetings. That's when Baldwin approached him about the possibility of doing a service project for Nocatee. The two men settled on the litter pickup event.

With the event's successful outcome, organizers foresee more litter pickup events sponsored by the Rotary Club of Ponte Vedra in the future.
