Vana Prewitt began her peace work at the age of 14 when she took to the streets to protest the VietNam war. At the same time, Bobby Kennedy had just been shot in her Los Angeles neighborhood. The day after, she swore she would one day join the U.S. Peace Corps. She was 30 when she flew to Liberia to serve as an instructional radio producer and trainer for a rural radio network broadcasting in 16 indigenous languages. That was where she met Rotary, vaccinating children in the bush in 1985.

She joined Rotary in 2005 and served again in the Peace Corps in 2016 in St. Lucia. She is a member of the Rotary e-Club of World Peace and the webmaster for Partnering for Peace, a global organization dedicated to finding ways to partner Rotary Clubs with Peace Corps projects overseas, and served as the Public Image Chair for District 6960 in Southwest Florida. In that role, she became familiar with the Youth & Peace in Action initiative being launched this September in Rotary Zones 33 and 34.

She is a member of RPCV clubs in Sarasota and Miami, is a Shriver donor to the National Peace Corps Association, and a member of Partnering for Peace

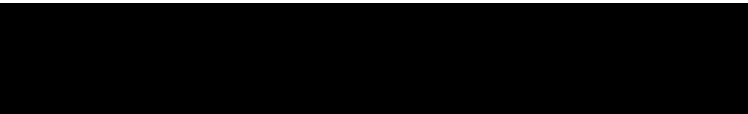
