Mark Lampmann: My Rotary Exchange Story





If you skipped the session to shine your bowling ball or tend to some other pressing business, you missed a treat. MARK LAMPMANN of White Salmon, Washington, told us how RI changed his life. As a teenager in a small town, he surprised himself by qualifying for and then experiencing a year in the Philippines as an RI exchange student.

This unusual experience (most kids from White Salmon think the height of travel adventure is a day trip to Portland) led a retired Admiral to take an interest in Mark and that in turn led Mark to thinking he would love to attend the Naval Academy. It took a year of prep school to get up to speed academically but he got in, graduated and subsequently became a Navy Seal. He started Seal School with 200 sailors who all thought they were tougher than a \$2 steak. Only 33 made it to graduation. He ultimately retired at the rank of Lieutenant Commander and is now pursuing a second career in Central Florida with New York Life.

This speaker encouraged us to keep our eyes on the big picture. Nobody knows where the ripples stop when a pebble gets tossed into the pond of service. Mark presented a story that can make all of us proud of the part every club plays in creating life-changing opportunities for exchange kids. The world is a better place for what Rotarians do, day in and day out. Give yourself a hand!



Directed by Missy Barnes and Eric Zivot Music Direction by Jason M. Bailey Choreography by Robin Gerchman


