Lisa Warren, representing Alzheimer's and Dementia Resource Center which is one of our 501c3 clients, gave a compelling story about her personal experience with Dementia. This experience inspired her to establish the ADRC to help caregivers for loved ones with Alzheimers and dementia.

Lisa Warren has lived in Central Florida for over 40 years, graduating from Winter Park High School and UCF. She was a marketing and community relations professional for many years before retiring to care for her husband who developed Early Onset Alzheimer's at age 56.

Lisa loves to volunteer in the community and currently is a driver for Meals on Wheels in Orange County and a docent at the Harry P. Leu House Museum in Leu Gardens. She channelled her caregiving experiences into advocacy for Alzheimer's, and now sits on the board of the Alzheimer's & Dementia Resource Center where she helps others on the journey.

Candidates have until 15 May to submit applications to their districts. Districts have until 1 July to submit endorsed applications to The Rotary Foundation.
