An update on Rosanna and Roy, and this part of our journey in life

Rosanna remains and will remain in Forestview Skilled Nursing Center, 2121 Edinboro Road, Erie PA, 16505, USA. She is stable, but cannot walk. It is a good place with some maddening elements. It has its elements that remind one of college dorm

restrictions before 1968. She does complain about the food - in a sense that is good. Most of the aids are great. Intellectually she is doing fine, but of course can be down at times - as am I. She does enjoy the cards of encouragement, love, and thoughts that she receives.

As for us as a couple, we decided to leave our home known to our Brit friends as "Rose Cottage" on South Shore Drive here in Erie. As a result, a realtor was found, the house listed and while a week of madness with twenty-three showings in three days and then more, a proposal was made, accepted and we anticipate all will go well on the closing date - Oct 19th. Have not been through that process in thirty years - so much to it. The same day of closing, a diminished amount of our furniture, possessions and pictures and "stuff" with great memories will be moved into the apartment at Springhill that I will occupy.

If you are not familiar with Springhill, Springhill is a senior living community with "continuum of care". My apartment is independent living. I will have my car, can do essentially what I want - but with a support system of nursing assistance, food services, a pool, workout center, etc. and emergency response. Continuum of care provides me, if I were (more likely when) to need it, assisted living as well as skilled nursing care where Rosanna is, that will be available to me. With no family here in Erie, this makes sense to us.

My days have been very busy and am tired when I hit the bed - with not a little bit stress. Being alone in the house, without Rosanna, has been daunting, I am sure you can appreciate that. This gives you some sense of the pressure of the enterprise. Sale, pack, and now notifying utilities, etc. Prayerfully, I will have less stress, be close to Rosanna and have a safety net for me when I get to Springhill.

We will celebrate our sixtieth wedding anniversary on December 29th - so while this part of the journey is difficult, we are still together with great memories that have included you. That is the fifty-cent version of what is going on in our lives. We both enjoy getting communications from you - be it text, email, Facebook, Messenger, and snail mail. I will be living at: Apartment 380, Springhill, 2323 Edinboro Road, Erie, PA 16509, USA. Cell and land line phone numbers remain the same. Rosanna and I appreciate your care and thoughtful messages and all the memories we have made with you and many others.
