Once a week on 93.7 The Fan, he has �Card of the Week� where he gives away a card. He tries to keep it topical and really enjoys it. Jeff�s favorite card that he ever owned, and was the #1 card asked for in his store, is a Roberto Clemente 1955 Tops card. The most valuable card he sold was a 1952 Mickey Mantle rookie card. Coincidentally, 1952 was the first year Tops started making baseball cards.
