DISTRICT FOUNDATION UPDATE

On behalf of the Rotary Foundation, I would like to thank those individuals and clubs that supported both the Rotary Foundation and Polio Plus for the Rotary year 2020 - 2021. As the final numbers of giving will not be available until mid-September, the current amount that has been donated to the Annual Fund is \$154,508.00 and to Polio Plus is \$24,476.00. This compares to the giving in 2019 - 2020 of \$166,968.00 to the Annual Fund and \$30,110.00 to Polio Plus.

As we move into a new Rotary year, I encourage clubs and individuals to consider the Rotary Foundation and Polio Plus as a part of their giving. To date, only 9 of our 42 clubs have entered their goals for the Annual Fund and Polio Plus into Rotary Club Central. I encourage club leaders to get these goals entered as soon as possible. If the goals are not entered by the end of August, I will enter the goals on your behalf.

In this newsletter, IPDG Beth Marshall, our District Polio Plus Chair, has included a flyer on how you can support Polio Plus, as well as beautify your homes and communities in the spring with the blooming of tulips. I hope you take advantage of this great opportunity.



ROTARY CLUB OF LEECHBURG TRIBUTE TO DR. ARTHUR DUPPSTADT



The Rotary Club of Leechburg was saddened by the news of the passing of long time member Dr. Arthur Duppstadt, on July 10th, at the age of 97. Dr. Duppstadt joined Leechburg Rotary in 1950. He was a multi-time recipient of the Paul Harris Fellowship. He hosted many Rotary social gatherings at his home over the years.

Doc served in the 355th Fighter Group,8th Air Force from 1943-45. On August 28th,1944 Arthur was shot down over German occupied France and made his way through the French Underground to Paris. He served as a fighter pilot instructor until his discharge.

He married the love of his life Nancy in 1947. He came from a family of optometrists. After graduating from the Pennsylvania College of Optometry in 1949 he opened a practice in Vandergrift and Leechburg, serving the community with their optic needs until 2019. He was always thinking of ways to improve optometry and developed several Optometry patents. Doc took pride in his legacy of community service. He was a recycler before it was in vogue. In the early 70s he was recycling newspapers. Leechburg Rotarians smashed glass and crushed cans manually. Eventually the Leechburg Recycling Center came into being after Doc's effort of applying for many grants. Many past District Governors had a tour of Doc's recycling center during the District Governor's visits over the years. In 1987 Arthur was called to Harrisburg to receive the prestigious Governor's Waste Minimization Award for his work in recycling.

As a community leader Doc was the first president of Lower Kiski Ambulance Service. A member of the Roaring Run Watershed Association and received their first Environmentalist of the year award, He served on the Penn State Advisory Committee, was a life member of the American Legion, VFW Post 566 and the Apollo Elks.

He was the longtime chairperson of the fund-raising Leechburg Rotary Auction where he often bid up an item to get a higher price but more than once ended up buying the item.

In addition to his parents Dr. Duppstadt was preceded in death by his loving wife Nancy in April 2020 and a son Todd.

Dr. Arthur Duppstadt will be missed by all.

A Celebration of Life Tribute to honor the lives of Arthur and Nancy will be held on Saturday July 31, 2021 at 11:00am in Curran-Shaffer Funeral Home and Crematory, Inc, 100 Owens View Ave., Apollo.

INFORMATION SUBMITTED SHOULD BE IN THE FORM OF A RESOLUTION, ADOPTED AT A REGULAR MEETING OF THE CLUB. THE NAMED CANDIDATE HAS TO BE NOMINATED AND APPROVED BY A MAJORITY OF THE CLUB MEMBERS. THE RESOLUTION SHALL BE CERTIFIED BY THE CLUB SECRETARY. A CLUB MAY SUGGEST A CANDIDATE WHO IS A MEMBER OF ANOTHER CLUB, SO LONG AS THE SUGGESTING CLUB FIRST OBTAINS CONCURRENCE OF THE CANDIDATES CLUB

CANDIDATES ARE REQUIRED TO HAVE BEEN A MEMBER IN GOOD STANDING FOR AT LEAST SEVEN YEARS AND HAVE SERVED A FULL YEAR AS PRESIDENT. THE CANDIDATE MUST AGREE IN WRITING TO HAVING THEIR NAME SUBMITTED.
